XX. Amendments

Subject to the approval of the Board of Trustees, this constitution may be amended by the Senate by a majority vote of the members present at two regular meetings, written notice having been given to each member at least two weeks prior to any meeting when an amendment is to be considered.

This constitution may be amended by the Board of Trustees. Notice shall be given to the President and Senate of the University when such amendments are under consideration by the Board of Trustees.

President McVey outlined certain recommendations to be made to the Legislature and called attention to some changes that should be made in our entrance credits.

The Senate met in regular session Monday, January 17, 1918, President McVey presiding. Quorum present.

The minutes of the December meeting of the Faculty were read and approved.

Dr. Boyd, Chairman of the Committee to codify the rules of the Senate, reported the recommendation of the Committee on Entrance Requirements as follows:

Any graduate of an accredited school will be admitted who presents three units in English, one unit in Plane Geometry, one unit in Algebra and ten other units selected from any subjects counted by an accredited school for graduation. Four units may be in vocational subjects.

Students not graduates of an accredited school must pass examinations on fifteen units distributed in the same way.

After the year 1918-19, no student will be admitted with a condition.

On motion the Senate voted to make the new entrance requirements retroactive for students who entered the University this school year.

President McVey asked the Senate to elect two of its members to membership in the Council. On second ballot Doctor Tuttle and Professor Roberts were elected.

The Senate approved the continuation of the Committee on Classification of Proposed Senate Legislation.
