Two neighboring counties are at the center of an issue in the Lexington may-

issue in the Lexington may oral race.
Census data from 2000 said that Clark and Mont-gomery counties have a combined population of about 56,000, a little more than double UK's enroll-

ment, but only one-fifth the total population of Fayette County. Yet one of these could be the site for Lexington's new airport, under an idea proposed by mayoral candidate Teresa Isaac.

Isaac said there is not enough room surrounding Blue Grass Airport for an expansion of one of the existing runways and that

Mayoral candidate Scott Crosbie disagreed and said that, while the city should work with surrounding counties, the airport should remain in Lexington.
"Air traffic is critical to our community and economy," he said at a recent debate.
Crosbie said that expansion of one of the runways



Chechens storm Moscow theater

Chechens storm Moscow theater MOSCOW—About 50 armed Chechen rebels stormed a crowded Moscow theater during a musical show Mednesday night and took hundreds of audience members hostage. Police and security forces surrounded the building amid sporadic gunfre. Moscow police spokesman Valery Gribakin said about 100 women and children had been let out of the theater. "The terrorists are demanding one thing — the end to the war in Chechnya," Gribakin said. Russian news reports said the armed men and women were laying land mines inside the theater and had explosives strapped to their bodies which they threatened to blow up if Russian security forces stormed the building. A woman who made her way out of the batter old a television et by took the stage, fined into the air and said: "Don't you understand what's going on? We are Chechens." Russia is involved in a bloody war in Chechnya, seeking to put down a decadeold separatist insurrection in the oil-rich region.

#### Bush signs defense spending bill

Bush signs defense spending bill

WASHINGTON — President Bush
signed into law Wednesday the biggest
military spending increase since Ronald
Reagan's administration — a \$355.5 billion
package giving the wartime Pentagon
"every resource, every weapon and every
tool they need." Overwhelmingly approved
by Congress, the measure contains a 4.1
percent salary increase for military personnel, \$74.5 billion to keep developing a
baillistic missile defense system and \$72.5
billion for new weapons. With the president contemplating war against Iraq, and
US. troops involved in an anti-terror campaign across the globe, the law increases
Pentagon spending in almost every area
for the budget year that began Oct. 1 by a
total of more than \$34.4 billion, or 11 percent, over the previous year. It was the
biggest increase in 20 years.

National security adviser Concleezza Rice said the United States sees the potential for a diplomatic solution to the problem because North Korea's impoverished conditions give outside powers ways to exert economic pressure on Pyongyang.

overturn the verdict, said the justices
missed an opportunity to rein in runaway
verdicts.



# **Hunt for sniper moves across** nation; police search for 2 men

U.S. official: Authorities looking for two people in Tacoma, Wash., one formerly connected to Army

TACOMA, Wash. —
The search for the serial sniper jumped across the country Wednesday as FBI agents converged on a home in Tacoma with metal detectors and chain saws.

A US. official in Washington said authorities were looking for two "people of interest" — one of them formerly connected to Fort Lewis, an Army base south of Tacoma.



The issue of nuclear weapons — who should have them and who should not — is a question we have been asking for almost a half-century. The North Koreans were assisted mightily by China and Russia, and as far as we know the two nations could still be aiding the isolated community in Northeast Asia. North Korea was once a prominent ally to the Soviet Union and is one of the few communist regimes left in the world. It is of little wonder that North Korea joined the "Axis of Evil" even though it has very little in common with Iran or Iraq.

Hussein's Iraq is a far more sec-

Hussein's Iraq is a far more sec-ular state, and also the one most vulnerable to regime change. Exe-cuting regime change in Py-ongyang would, at best, be an exer-cise in futility. China would surely not sit back and watch one of its neighbors get thrashed by a West-

ern government, and North Korea could inflict casualties on this country the likes of which we have seen only once before, when we fought ourselves from 1861-1865.

How the United States should react to this revelation is certainly open to question. The president has only recently received the blessing from Congress to attack Saddam if necessary, but he now must deal with a nation that has documented nuclear capabilities.

If the North Koreans could be linked to Al-Qaeda we would have an extremely delicate situation on our hands. Indeed, we ought to be fortunate that North Korea does not engage in the beliliose rhetoric of the state of the strength of the state of the strength of the state of the strength of the state of th

Israel destroyed Iraq's capacity to launch nuclear weapons, but now Saddam may be building up his arsenal. In the minds of some conspiracy theorists he may be supplying North Korea with their technology.

Let us make one thing perfectly clear: If a link can be established

between any two of the ballyhooed "Axis of Evil" countries this nation is in deep trouble.
Containment against the Koreans is advisable, if not unavoidable. No, we do not approve of the way that the government goes about its business, but we really do not have any other choice unless an aforementioned link is established.
Iran may be closer to commencing the democratic process than any of its neighbors, but in the meantime it still poses a threat to Israel. Would the "Butcher of Baghdad" actually extort the United States if he procured these weapons of nuclear capability, or would he abstain from using them, ever wary of the consequences that could be rendered?
No nation or militant leader yet has had the intestinal fortitude to create in But if North Korea's leadership ever falls into the wrong hands, we may be forced to abandon policies of containment.

In a sense, North Korea is an

embarrassment to the United States, but we have no alternative but to wait and see right now. We do not have the moral authority to order them to disarm, as we do in Baghdad, and they surely would not comply anyway.

That would leave our country to choose between another blow to our already deteriorating prestige, or a hellish campaign in the woods of Northeast Asia.


