## Speaker kicks off events

The lingering psychological effects of slavery transcend both race and gender boundaries, guest lecturer Nell Painter said during her presentation "A Fedulain Look at Women and American Shavediwards Professor of American History at Princeton, is working on a biography on Sojourner Truth, a women's rights advocate and black abolitionist.

Her speech, sponsored by the UK Women's Studies department, kicked off UK's celebration of Women's History Month.

Painter's biography, "Sojourner Truth, A Life, A Symbol," scheduled to be published in 1996, studies both the life and the psyche of slaves and non-slaves.

#### NATION Senator offered resignation before vote

WASHINGTON — Republican Sen. Mark Hatfield, whose solitary defiance of his own party helped bring down the balanced budget amendment last week, offered to resign before the vote, Majority Leader Bob Dole said yesterday.

Dole, R-Kam., speaking on CBS "Face the Nation," also said President Clinton used the bal-anced budget debate to discredit Dole, a potential rival in next year's presidential campaign.

"The president and the Democratic leadership in the Senate decided this might be a pretty good shot at Bob Dole because the leaders who voted for this last year voted against it this year, with President Clinton's blessing at least."

Hatfield joined 33 Democrats last week in sending the balanced budget amendment, which needed a two-thirds majority, to a one-vote deleat.

#### Bald eagle deaths raise concern

MILWAUKEE — The death of more than 50 bald eagles in two states has scientists looking for answers before more harm comes to the majestic birds brought back from near-extinction over the past 20 years.

"Something is killing them quickly," said Thomas Roffe, a veterinary medical officer in charge of field investigations at the National Wildlife Health Center in Madison.

Nine birds died this year in southern Wisconsin and 27 more have died in southwestern Arkansas since November. No one knows why.

Environmentalists express the same concern, recalling the drop in raptor populations before DDT was banned in 1972. The pesticide and other chemicals ingested through their prey weakened the birds' shells, hampering reproduction.

#### Internet goes into space with Endeavour

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. — It was bound to happen: Cyberspace meets outer space. For the first time, NASA is providing public computer access to virtually all aspects of a space shuttle flight via the Internet, including occasional exchanges with Endeavour's seven astronauts and continuous updates on their astronomical observations.

continuous updates on their assumments and a continuous. Computer users can even "Come Aboard," and receive pictures and audio tapes of the crew. It's causing a cyberspace stampede. More than \$50,000 requests for mission information have poured in since Endeavour blasted off Thursday.

The Madness of King George,' Starring Nigel Hawthorne and Helen Mirren Samuel Goldwyn

"The Madness of King George," based on the play by Alan Bennett, is the story of the king's delusional illness of por-phyria, a hereditary blood defect that King George III suffered from during his reign in England from 1760 to 1820.

"The Madness of King George" is not rated and will play at the Kentucky Theater Friday through Sunday.

Nominated in the Academy Awards category of Best Actor, Nigel Hawthorne plays the king who begins to suffer bouts of hyperactivity and aggression after England loses the American colonies and both Parliament and

England loses the American colonies and both Parliament and the monarchy battle for control of England.

Matters are complicated by the Prince of Wales (Rupert Everett), vying for his father's position by trying to convince Parliament that he should claim the throne because of his father's illness.

Parliament decides that if the king does not receive a doctor-approved stamp of sanity, the Prince of Wales should assume duties of king.

king. A parade of quacky medieval doctors, whose medical expertise reaches as far as the leather constraints they put on George and a constant harking of the color of his urine,

As a last resort, the court brings in a psychotherapist, Dr. Willis (lan Holm), who attempts to cure the afflicted by searing the body with heated jars and cleaning the system with burgatives.

The brightest moments of the film come when the king loses all caution and runs through the English countryside, cavorting through fields in his nightgown, kissing attendants and giving an off-key harpsichord performance for his court.
