

## **Pioneer** of UK opera dies at 62

Gail Robinson, renowned Metropolitan Opera singer and in-fluential member of UK's opera program, died of rheumatoid arthritis Sunday morning. She was

her main focus as the illness took its toll, and she never missed a class even when she should have, said Cliff Jackson, a UK vocal coach and assistant professor of

coach and assistant protessor or voice.

"I have never seen someone so committed to their job," Jackson said. "She would not let her health get to her. I know that if I was in her position and in so much pain, I would have been absent more."

Robinson's close connection with her students can be traced to her being a mother of two children.

"There was a motherliness about her that she shared with her

The work Mitchell has done with civil rights cases has not only changed history, but the scope of journalism as well, said Al Cross, the director of the Institute for Rural Journalism and Community Issues and the organizer of the event.

Mitchell's investigation of civil rights court cases has inspired other journalists and federal investigators to re-examine 29 killings of the civil rights ent that have led to 23 convictions.

Although he has been called a "white traitor" and has endured threats against his life and his family. Mitchell said the importance of what he is doing outweighs the threats.

Often termed a hero for his endeavors, Mitchell is humbled by that praise.
"Over the years, people have sud that I am a hero for what I have done," Mitchell said. "The real heroes are the people who were involved in the civil rights movement and fought to ensure that all Americans are free. I think they are the real heroes."
Mitchell will speak at 7 p.m. in the Center Theater of the Student Center. The event is free and open to the public and is sponsored by the UK School of Journalism and Telecommunications.

Locke will have surgery at a date to be
determined. It is the second straight
week the Cats have lost a top offensive
player to a season-ending injury. Last
week, senior wide receiver Dicky Lyons
Jr. suffered a knee injury.
Brooks said UK's three other runming backs. Tomy Dixon, Alfonso Smith
and Moncell Allen, will have to pick up
in Locke's absence.

"Obviously Moncell will get more

carries and I'm hopeful Tony will come back with some spring in his step because of his experience," Brooks said. "Going along with that, Alfonso will also be a much greater factor going forward after the first seven games."



### Workers awarded millions in modern-day slavery case

MIAMI — Three Cuban men
who were forced to work against
their will repairing ships for a Cuban
joint venture in Curacao won an \$80
million judgment Monday in U.S.,
federal court in Miami.
Alberto Jasto Rodriguez, Fernando Alonso Hernandez and Luis Albetto Casanova Toledo sued the Cutareao Drydock Co., alleging the company conspired with the Cuban government and forced them into virtual
slave labor in order to pay off a debt
the Cuban government had with the
company.
After hearing tearful testimony
from the three men describing 16hour working days — sometimes for
as many as 45 days straight — U.S.
District Court Judge James L. King
decided the evidence was 'overwhelming and uncontradicted.''
The men told King how they, hid
on-the-job injuries from their supervisors so they would not get in troubie.
Alonso, who spent 10 years in Curacao, lost a finger and suffered serious
burns.
He was awarded \$30 million. The
others were awarded \$35 million
cach.
"I have never even seen \$1,000
together," Alonso said after the judgment. "I feel complete. We are in the
best country in the world for justice."
The men won their lawsuit in


