

MINUTES OF THE SENATE FEBRUARY 12, 1923

The University Senate met in the Little Theatre Monday, March 12, President McVey presiding.

The minutes of January 8 were read and approved.

The following report was made by the Committee appointed to prepare resolutions on the death of Mr. Courtney Smiser:

"The Members of the Senate of the University of Kentucky wish to express sincere sympathy to the family and friends of our deceased colleague, Mr. Courtney Smiser, on account of their bereavement.

Mr. Smiser was a member of the faculty of the College of Engineering. He was a good teacher, beloved by both students and fellow members of the staff.

Through his untimely death the University has lost a valued trainer of young men, and his associates have lost the fellowship of a delightful personality."

The following recommendations from the College of Arts and Sciences were approved:

1. That History and Political Science 53 be replaced by History and Political Science 53a and 53b - Legislative Procedure. .3 credit per semester.
2. That English 12 - Debate Practice - be replaced by English 12a and 12b, Debate Practice, 2 credits per semester.

Senate approved the following recommendations from the College of Engineering:

- ✓ Practical Mechanics 7a - Required of all freshmen in engineering. Bench work in wood, wood turning, pattern making and foundry practice. Eight hours a week. First semester. Repeated second semester.
- ✓ Practical Mechanics 7b - Required of all freshmen in engineering. Continuation of practical mechanics 7a. Second semester. Repeated first semester.
- ✓ Practical Mechanics 8a - Required of all sophomores in engineering. Forging, machine work and automobile repairing. Prerequisites, Practical Mechanics 7a and 7b. Six hours a week. First semester. Repeated second semester.
- ✓ Practical Mechanics 8b - Required of all sophomores in engineering. Continuation of Practical Mechanics 8a. Six hours a week. Second semester. Repeated first semester.

Note: - Practical Mechanics 7a and 7b will replace Practical Mechanics 1 (wood working), P. M. 2 (pattern making) and 3a and 3b (foundry work). Practical Mechanics 8a and 8b will replace P. M. 4 (forge shop), P. M. 5 (machine shop) and P. M. 6 (Practical automotive work).

Senate approved the request of a group of students to be allowed to petition Delta Delta Delta fraternity.

MINUTES OF THE SENATE MARCH 12, 1923

The Senate met in the Little Theatre Monday, March 12 at 3:45, President McVey presiding.

The minutes of February 12 were read and approved.

The following recommendations of the Rules Committee were approved:

✓ "Membership in Fraternities" - revised to read:

"No student shall be initiated into a fraternity until he or she has been in residence at the University one semester, with a standing of 1 on his entire semester's schedule, which shall consist of not less than 12 credit hours. A group must have a standing of one to have the privilege of initiation."

✓ Weekly Convocation - revised to read:

"All members of the freshman class are required to attend convocation."

✓ Probation - first paragraph changed to read:

"A student is placed on probation when his standing upon his entire schedule for his preceding semester is less than 1."

In second paragraph, omit: "or grades of A, B or C in 12 hours' work."

Omit last paragraph, as unnecessary duplication.

✓ Extra Curricular Activities - substitute for first paragraph:

"To be eligible to participate in extra-curricular activities, such as extra-mural athletics, public speaking, dramatics, membership on staffs of University publications, class offices, sponsorships, a student must have met the full entrance requirements and must, except in cases of students registered for the first time, have carried during the preceding semester at least 12 credit hours, and must be carrying a schedule of at least 12 credit hours, and must not be on probation."

Athletics

"At the opening of each University year, students are required to present certificates of physical fitness from the University physician before engaging in any athletic contest."
