As part of the evening, there will be live entertainment at two locations in the park. Headlining the production will be 80's superstar Shannon, performing her hits "Let The Music Play" and "Give Me Tonight." Other gblt supportive performers will be featured.

Pride Night is organized by The Gay and Lesbian Community Center of Cincinnati with the income making up a large percent of The Center's

annual budget. It is a unique opportunity for the GLBT community to get together and party in a safe and affirming atmosphere.

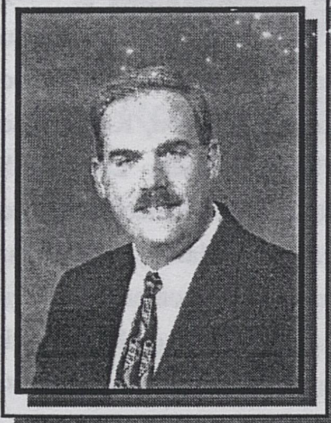
This years festival is a retreat featuring a collaborative experience for artists, activists, and women concerned about the issues facing women in Appalachia. Saturday

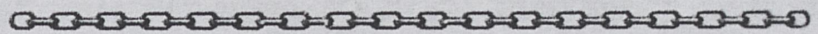
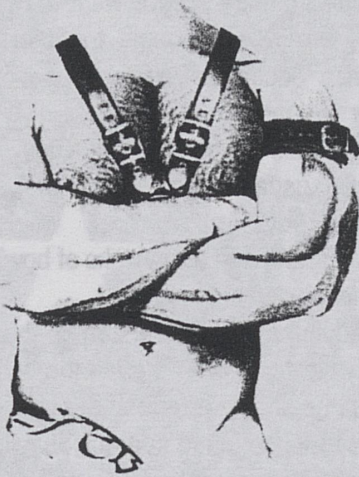

Rainbow Bowling

It's that time of the year again, Lexington's Rainbow Bowling League is preparing for its winter season. The Rainbow League is a gay/lesbian league that was started by members of the GLSO in the mid-eighties and is one of the hundreds of gay/lesbian bowling leagues that belong to the International Gay Bowling Organization. It is a recreational league that is handicapped so everyone plays on an equal basis.

There will be a meeting at Joyland Bowl on Tuesday, Sept 4, at 7:45 pm, to finalize arrangements for the winter season. If you're looking for a place to socialize outside the bars, this is your chance to make new friends and have a lot of fun.

The league will be undergoing a face-lift this year. First, the league is moving to Joyland Bowl off Paris Pike on Rogers Rd; the move was necessary due to scheduling conflicts with Southland Lanes. We will also be bowling earlier this year since Joyland was able to facilitate this request.

In addition, the cost of bowling will be reduced. The weekly bowling fee is tentatively set at \$9 per week, pend-

ing approval at the organizational meeting. There is also a once-a-year sanction fee that must be paid to bowl on the league.

The league hopes that the earlier time slot and the lower cost will allow more people to come out and bowl. The league currently bowls with teams of three and three people can join as a team.. If you want to bowl and do not have a team, we will put people together to make full teams. We also occasionally need substitutes when a team member is unable to be present.

The league will begin bowling Tues., Sept 11 at 7:45pm (bowling usually lasts 1.5 to 2 hrs). There will be 14 weeks of bowling, a three week break for Christmas/New Years, 14 more weeks of bowling, a season roll-off, and finally an awards banquet.

The schedule has been adjusted so that college students will be able to bowl in the league without missing matches at the beginning or end of the season. The Carnegie Center, songwriting classes begin in September and on Sept 5 we will be playing at Lynagh's Music Emporium with Mother Jane, 9 pm

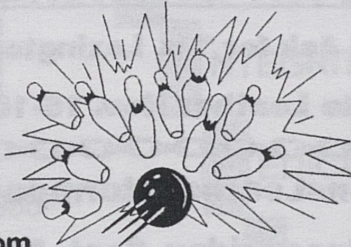
