Chicago - Sunday - June 3, 1917

My dearest Marjorie :-

This is the very first
weekiversary of the momentous occasion that
made us one, dearie, and it was just about this
hour that ~~the~~ we were married, for it is almost
5 P.M. (Detroit time). How much more like a
month ago it all seems!

Well, your boy has been celebrating the
day very soberly. I told you in one of yesterday's
letters, I believe, that I didn't care if that
strong old breeze blew all night if it only
blew in some summer weather. And it
succeeded, darling, in doing that very thing.

'Tis a beautiful day here, warm, but with a
cooling breeze, and it is so sunny and pleasant.

This morning Brooks and I walked away
down to the zoo at Lincoln Park and back -
from seven to eight miles - and since dinner
we've both had good little snoozes. I expect
that all of us, except Curtis, will be at Maria's
