## **WORLD** Dogs find more dead as death toll mounts

KOBE, Japan — Swiss rescue dogs de search teams to more entombed bodies yesterday as the earthquake death toll swelled past 4,000, and the bark of a pet dog led to one woman's rescue after more than two icy days in the wreckage.

New fires burst out around the shattered city, and firefighters' efforts to douse them were stymied by crushed water mains. With government relief efforts falling far short of victims' needs, thousands more gave up hope of finding food and shelter and joined the stream of residents abandoning the city on foot.

By early today, confirmed deaths totaled 4,047, making Tuesday's 7.2-magnitude earthquake the worst in Japan in more than 70 years.

WASHINGTON — Despite the Clinton administration's aggressive campaign for trade agreements, America's trade deficit is worsening and on track toward a record exceeding \$150 billion for 1994.

The Commerce Department reported yesterday that the deficit in November climbed 4.3 percent to \$10.35 billion, up from a revised \$10.10 billion in October.

SPRINGFIELD, Tenn. — A Confederate flag flying from the bed of a 19-year-old white man's pickup truck played a central role in his shooting death just two days before the Martin Luther King holiday. Freddy Morrow, Damien Darden and Tony Andrews, all 17, and Marcus Merriweather, 15, were charged yesterday with first-degree murder in Saturday's slaying of Michael David Westerman of Elkton, Ky.

### Joel in Japan during quake



ALBANY, N.Y. — Billy Joel doesn't start the fire — he just seems to be around while it's burning. Joel performed in Moscow during its political upheavals and in Berlin on the might of German reunification. On Tuesday, he was trying to sleep in a hotel room in Osaka when the huge earthquake hit. Joel, who was unhurt, said mirrors and paintings fell from the walls, a heavy desk flipped over and his bed bucked and heaved across the room.

"I've had a number of near-death experiences and what usually happens is this incredible sense of fatalism comes over you," he said. "You accept the idea that this could be your last second and almost funny thoughts come into your head."

# SGA may ask that honor code be looked into

A Student Government Association leader has begun a movement to institute a student honor code at UK.
Avi Weitzman, SGA's executive director for cademic affairs, has researched similar honor codes at Tennessee, Vanderbilt, Alabama, North Carolina and other major universities and feels those schools' positive experiences are a reason for UK to research honor codes.


"I've seen a lot of cheating at this University," said Weitzman, a political science junior. "I think that a lot of students have no respect at all for academic honesty and integrity. Something like an honor code might be a step toward change."

An SGA committee Wednesday night discussed a bill that would request that the University Senate cestablish an ad hoc committee of faculty, students and administrators to investigate whether a student honor code might work at UK. The full SGA senate will vote on the measure this Wednesday, Weitzman said.

"I'm not asking SGA or the University Senate to institute a code," he said, "I'd do think that we should research and debate the issue."

In his own research, Weitzman has found more student-oriented systems of justice regarding issues like cheating and dishonesty. He said restructuring the way UK deals with students who violate rules is not bad, but that in researching an honor code, committee members might discover better methods. At the very least, Weitzman said, an honor code would help serve as a conscience to students who might think about doing something dishonest to pass a test or a class.



### The Personal Responsibility Act

An anti-social program, it will attempt to combat teen pregnancy by eliminating welfare benefits to unwed mothers under the age of 21.

Revised unemployment regula-tions and strict job-search requirements round out the per-sonal responsibility package.







# Abramson may reenter U of L search

Just weeks after pulling himself out of the running for the job of president at the University of Louisville, Mayor Jerry Abramson says he may be reconsidering.

Abramson told Louisville's WHAS-TV Wednesday night that he is reviewing his decision to withdraw from the search.

"If in fact there's an even playing field, an opportunity to be a legitimate candidate for what would be a very exciting position, I would reassess my position and allow the system or the process to

George Fischer, co-chairman of the search committee looking for U of L's next president, said if Abramson rejoins the search now, he would be one of 35 candidates left for the post. Fischer said the pool has been whittled from a field of 160 applicants.

"He's more than welcome to recenter the search process," said Fischer, who also owns Cervend, Inc., a vending corporation.

As part of an open-ended search, Fischer said, the school has invited all interested applicants to apply. Fischer said reassessing," Abramson said.
