



Superintendent Eddie Michael said the district's facility plan showed, a need for more science and technology labs at the high school, and this addition and renovation was a step in that direction. "It's somewhat crowded there and has been for several years," Michael said. Part of the money for the project, \$525,000, will come from the Kentucky School Facilities Construction Commission in the form of building bonds. The remaining \$819,000 will come from the school board's general fund. "This gets the maximum amount of state money that we can use," Michael said. "To get that money from the state, this is the size project we would have to build."








