TO GERMANY IS SENT TO BERLIN

Message Intended to Hold Germany Up to Eyes of World As Outlaw Nation

FRANCE DETERMINES TO BUILD DEFENSES

Germany Flatly Rejects Pro-tests Lodged Against Reich Rearmament

Paris, March 21—(INS)— In a sternly worded note of protest, intended to hold Germany up to the eyes of the world as an outlaw nation, Prance today warned the Reich that she could not hope to enter the peace councils of Europe on the basis of her rearmed status.

France's protest, delivered to for-sign minister Constantin Von Neu-rath in Berlin this morning, is un-lerstood to have told Germany that t would be impossible to exclude sonsideration of her unilateral vio-ation of the Versailles Treaty arms revisions in any Turther arma-nents negotiations.

GERMANY REJECTS

After the senate passed by an overwhelming vote the bill to increase the conscription service period from one to two years during the forthcoming four "Flean years," Chamber of Deputies approved the Air Ministry's request for \$100,000-100 to make France's air force the year. This is a \$34,000,000 increase over the original budget figure.


