

This indenture made this sixth day of February
Eighteen hundred and forty nine between Thomas
Willson of the one of Woodford county of the one part
and the heirs of Thomas Lym^{decd} (viz) Mary Lym Widow
and relict of said Decedent Sampson Lym Mary Lym
William Lym James Lym and Jane Frances Lym all
of the county of Woodford and Daniel Lym and
Elizabeth Hendrix late Lym of the county of
Jefferson Thomas Lym and Martha James late
Lym of the county of Boone all of the State of
Kentucky, and Matilda Dungan ^{of the county of Shelby} late Lym, and
the heirs of Nancy Williams ^{late Lym} (viz) Mary Elizabeth
Williams ^{and} Martha Williams ^{and} Wineford Williams
of the county of Clay and State of Missouri
of the other part Witnesseth that the said
Thomas Willson for an inconsideration of the sum
of Three hundred dollars to them in hand paid
by the said heirs of Thomas Lym decess the receipt
whereof is here by acknowledged both this day
bargained and sold unto the said heirs of Tho
Lym and by these presence do bargain sell
them and confirm to the said heirs of Tho Lym
Decess a certain tract or parcel of land situate
lying in the county of Woodford on the waters
of the Kentucky River and bounded as follows viz
Beginning at a Black locust on the west side of
a branch known by the name of Willsons
Branch thence South $34\frac{3}{4}$ E 80 poles ^{to a stake} thence E
 $34\frac{3}{4}$ N 60 poles to a Stake thence N $34\frac{3}{4}$ W
80 poles thence West $34\frac{3}{4}$ S 60 poles to the
beginning containing 30 Acres of land together
with all and every singular property
