Vote to impeach Glenn overturned

Retrial tonight: Glenn's up against the same four charges but has a thirdyear law student representing him; Lawyer says Glenn will plead not guilty

The vote to impeach Student Government Association President Jimmy Glenn has been overturned because Glenn was not properly notified of the trial. Glenn will be retried for the state of t

was operated.
Sen. Zach Webb, who brought
the four charges against Glenn,

served the notice to Glenn in person instead of in writing. Senate chairman Edwin Orange nullified the Dec. 6 vote. Another trial is only fair, he

said.

Glenn would not defend himself at the Senate's trial, citing improper notification. His silence led many undecided senators to vote for his

undecided senators to vote for his impeachment.

He is accused of four violations; burchasing and signing a contract for advertising with the Kernel before a budget was in place; failing to award Spring 2000 Child Care Grants; trying to replace the student representative on the Presidential Search Committee; and violating the oath of office.

In December, Senators found him guilty of each charge, and voted for his impeachment based on those findings.

Geoffroy visits campus, students

The facts: The Kernel spoke with UK Presidential Candidate Gregory Geoffroy about his thoughts on UK and why he wants to be president

This interview is the first of a three-part question and answer series on the presidential candidates.

The Kernel asked a series of questions to each candidate focused on campus issues.

Gregory Geoffroy is visiting campus today, Geoffroy is currently the provost at the University of Maryland. Below are Geoffroy's responses to the questions.

Questions Answers

Q: Students have criticized President Wethington for not interacting with them. Many students, when asked, are not even sure what his name is or what he looks like.

If you came to have what the way that he looks like to have if you have the students?

A: I think it is important for the president to be visible on campus and this can be done in formal and informal ways. We have at Maryland a very good presidential student advisory committee where students meet with the president once a month. I like that method very much and I think it works very well. This way we can hear the voices of students. I also think it is important to interact on an informal basis by hopping in to residence halls and dining halls. You don't have to do it every day but you can do it periodically. I would enjoy doing that. I like interacting with students and think it is very important to keep the finger on the pulse of the student population.

Q: Many students have expressed concerns at the presidential search forums about the growth of our University Many feel that there are too many buildings and not enough

Many feel that there are too many buildings and not encougar
green space.

How would you deal with this issue? Are you supportive
of campus growth, and if so, how do you propose that we do
have enough green space on campus?

A: I think the campus needs some serious facilities master planning. I noticed that when I informally visited UK's
campus a couple of weeks age.

I didn't see the kinds of green space that I'm used to. I
agree, I think green space is a very important component of
what makes a campus a campus. I would want to see some
very serious master planning done with an ailm to increase
campus green spaces. I agree completely.

Q: Many students on our campus feel very strongly about UK's involvement with the Fair Labor Association. Sweat-shop issues are very important to these students and there has been a committee formed to investigate the FLA and decide on a possible switch to the Workers' Rights Consortium. What is your position on sweatshop issues and would you be supportive of making a switch to another watchdog organization?

oe supportive or making a switch to another watchoog organization?

A: I think it does require very careful evaluation. No one can support sweatshops. It is very important that universities be seen as strong champions for fair labor issues. I think that the ball is still out as far as which of these organizations is going to be most effective, but from what I've read, the Worker's Rights Consortium hasn't become fully organized yet. The issue does require continued study.

Arab areas of Jerusalem.

Judge says '97 elections null and void

Judge says '97 elections null and void GEORGETOWN, Guyana — A High Court judge declared Guyana's 1997 general elections null and void because of fraud — but said she camnot order a change of government. About 30,000 registered voters were barred from casting ballots because they did not possess special identification cards. Justice Claudette Singh ruled Monday that lawmakers, who had approved the voting rules, had acted beyond their authority. Singh also said there was evidence of missing ballot boxes from opposition strongholds. But she said she could not order a change of government because there was no proof the alleged irregularities swung the vote decisively in the government's favor.

Kuwait's highest court rejects case

Kuwait's highest court rejects case
KUWAIT — Kuwait's highest court rejected
a case Tuesday in which activists had pleaded for
women to have the right to vote and run for office
in this oil-rich state. "The court has decided to
reject the case," said Judge Abdullah al-Issa,
president of the Constitutional Court. He offered
no immediate explanation. Frustrated with the
50-seat legislature that voted down an emiri decree and a bill for suffrage in 1999, women activists and their male supporters took their case
to courts. The case rejected Tuesday was filed by
a Kuwaiti man, Adnan al-Issa. He sued the elections department for failing to register the names
of women, including his wife, on voter's lists.

Sri Lankan army retakes rebel base

Sri Lankan army retakes rebel base
COLOMBO, Sri Lanka. — Government troops
and tanks, backed by MiG-27 jets, began an assall at dawn Tuesday to retake a major Tamil
Tiger rebel bastion in Sri Lanka, the military
said. One civilian was killed and several injuncy
in the first hour of fighting in northern Jaffia
Peninsula, said military spokesman Brig. Sanath
Karunaratne. Using tanks, heavy artillery and
aircraft, the army was trying to move toward the
strategic, rebel-held Elephant Pass, which connects the peninsula with the mainland. The loss
of Elephant Pass last year was seen as the army's
worst defeat in the 17-year separatist war.

ARLINGTON, Va. — NBC plans to expand episodes of "Friends" by 10 minutes and air live skits by the cast of "Saturday Night Live" to fight CBS "Survivor" on Thursday nights beginning Feb. 1, USA Today reported. The paper said in Tuesday's editions that new NBC entertainment president Jeff Zucker met with the "Friends cast last week to suggest expanding the episodes and include guest appearances by Susan Sarturday Night Live" skits are now scheduled for the first two weeks of February. but might continue beyond that. Another possibility is using "Friends" highlights from previous shows from 8:40 p.m EST to 9 p.m.

Jeff Van Gundy came out the worst Monday after a head-to-head collision with his own player Marcus Camby. Camby threw a punch at Danny Ferry late in the fourth quarter of New York's 10442 victory over the San Antonio Spurs, but the Spurs forward ducked the punch, and Camby inadvertently slammed into his coach. Camby was ejected from the game for the punch, while Van Gundy required 12-15 stitches to close the cut over his eye.

We are still movin' on down at Rupp ... but not for a ile, according to Assistant Athletics Director Kathy

The UK Athletics proposed plan of moving approximate-ly 1,600 students from lower arena to the end zone at Rupp will not be put into action until after the next basketball season, DeBoer said.

The renovation of Lexington Center as a whole will take cover the next two to three years. However, the actual ovation inside Rupp Arena will not occur until the end. ording to DeBoer.

"Students would like these changes to be made tomorrow and I don't blame them, but we have to work closely with Rupp Arena to get the seating plan ironed out." DeBoer said.

Some tentatively considered things to be included in the new seating plan would be standing-room-only places for students. However, standing room-only places for students. However, standing room spots and other changes students have requested are all "predicated on the new bleachers," said DeBoer.

DeBoer said that one thing is for sure: Students won't lose any seats.

"Everything is being done to increase the number of

any seats.
"Everything is being done to increase the number of dents that take part in the ball games," she said.
That is one good thing about extra time before

renovation.
"This will obviously involve the relocation of a signifi-cant amount of season ticket holders. This will give us time to find out where to put them." DeBoer said.
Finance senior David Lail thinks they should continue to look for other ways to improve student seating, while waiting for construction to begin.

waiting for construction to begin.
"If they are going to make an improvement to the seating, they should take a look at Duke's student seating and then come up with a plan," Lail said.
Regardless, ISC Senior Britt Clem thinks any plan of getting the students closer to the floor is a good one.

"I think it is a good idea to get students closer to the floor because it is our team and we can feel more part of the experience," Clem said.

However, Clem hopes the actual view of the game will improve with the move.

"If not, maybe they should re-evaluate the plan during this time," she said.

Q: What would your goals be for our University? What are some problem areas that you would like to remiedy as president?

A: The goal that the new president should have is the goal that the legislature has set — making UK a top-20 university.

A: I have spent my entire career in universities much like Kentucky—large public land grant universities. I un-derstand how they work and how you get things done.

"The reservations have brought new customers who may have passed a machine by because they underestimated how many videos were available in the machine," he said. "The web site lets you see how many videos are actually in stock, and

While there are web sites that allow to you rent videos through the mail, this is the first web site which enables users to actually reserve a copy.
Cinevault opened its first automated rental machine in Lexington in July 1999. The machines have been popular in Europe since the early 1990s.
The service is first come, first serve—the system has no preference for online or onsite rentals. If a member was at a Cinevault location at the same time a person was at the web site, whoever made their selection first would score the film.
Weare believes that this service will greatly benefit college students.
"Students who are looking

"Students who are looking for a break from their all night studies can go onto our site and reserve a movie without having to go out into the cold to a video store just to find out that the movie they want is out," he said. Michael McLaughlin, president of Video Vending North America and Cinevault, said Cinevault members pleased with the service.


"We have had nothing but positive feedback since adding the online service," he said.

Johnny Cash cannot be stopped. The man is a free-roaming legend of American culture who continues to capti-vate audiences with his pure endurance and unflinching mu-sical dedication and spirituali-ty.

For those who find the

sical dedication and spirituality.
For those who find the slightest hint of country/western music repugnant, take notice: "The Man in Black" transcendent of any musical categorization other than "legend."
Few artists have garnered as much respect and admiration across the musical lexicon as Cash, and as judged by the roster of contributors to American III, there has been no recent shortage. Tom Petty, Sheryl Crow, Merle Haggard, Benmont Tench and wife June Carter Cash are all aboard as Cash spreads his heart across 14 tracks of the familiar "American IIII."

icana" formula that originated with 1994's American Recordings.
Though the sparseness of Cash's aging voice becomes apparent, there is no lack of soul in these tunes. A testament to his fortitude, the album opens with the Tom Petty cover "I Won't Back Down" and from there strolls down a retrospective memory lane of sorts. The yearning sincerity in Cash's delivery is obvious as he sings "That Lucky Old Sun (Just Reiner of the Sun of the

tested Merle Haggard, and you'll see that there's still an inkling of defiance in his bones.

To bring things full circle, the album closes with the haunting, violin and accordianlaiden "Wayfaring Stranger which includes foreboding imager y alpenty. The song brings to an end an album in which Cash seems to accept his immortality; but whether or not the listening public is convinced is another matter.

This album is one for the

This album is one for the ages and is a touching validation of one of our great musical talents and his undying devo tion has been songered to the song offer the thoughts in his knowledgeable, well-traveled mind. American III is still superior despite the obvious waning of Cash's voice. But in this case its not the voice that matters, its simply the will to live, sing and preach the gospel that Johnny Cash has so fully mastered throughout his luminous career.







American relations between foreign powers strained due to funding from Iraq sent to U.S.

There are many words typically used to describe America's relationship with the rest of the world. "Hegemony" is a popular one, as is "superpower." NAFTA, the Marshall Plan, manifest destiny—our conduct in foreign affairs would have us believe that the other 180 or so independent, sovereign states on the planet exist solely because of our good and benevolent nature.

Well, foreign affairs have changed.

Iraq, hardly ascendant among the economic powers of the Earth, announced Monday that they would make available 100 million euros (roughly \$94 million) to alleviate the misery of the 30 million Americans living below the poverty line. Proceeds from oil sales will be directed in a bilateral program administered solely by Iraqi officials to buy food, medicine and other essential goods for our impoverished citizens.

for our impoverished citizens. This move is especially ironic given the fact that Iraq is currently under U.N. administration to relieve the suffering of a people shackled to a decade of economic sanctions stemming from the invasion of Kuwait.

This marks one of the first times that America is the recipient of foreign aid.

Even though the gesture is most certainly a sardonic political ploy rather than a measure truly designed to combat poverty (after all, the donations would amount to little over \$3 a person), it should cause the U.S. to re-examine its role in the global economy. Perhaps the indignation felt and the outcries raised over our na-

remaps the indignation fert and the outcries raised over our national sovereignty are not unique to us.

Perhaps the feeling that, thank you very much, we can manage our country and its problems just fine exists among the recipient nations of our massive foreign aid programs as well.

Maybe we're the Great Satan after all.





Former UK athlete faces assault charge

A UK football player, whose eligibility expired last fall, was arrested Monday on charges of second degree assault.

Jack Paul "Gus" Jacobs, 22, a senior from Louisville, was served with a warrant charging him with assaulting an unidentified adult male on Jan. 10 at about 1:15 am at the corner of South Limestone and Winslow streets.

The man was taken to Samaritan Hospital to be treated for injuries to the face and head, including lacerations that required stitches. He released that day.

The man filed the complaint against Jacobs at the Fayette Court the day of the incident.

UK Police arrested Jacobs at the courthouse, where he was facing an unrelated warrant for a failure to pay traffic fines. He was taken to Fayette County Detention Center where a \$5,000 bond was posted.

A preliminary hearing for the assault charge is scheduled for 830 a.m., Wednesday Feb. 6 at the courthouse.

Jacobs, a fullback, was a member of the football team from 1997 to 2001.

Cheerleader arrested on rape charge

A UK cheerleader was arraigned Wednesday on charges of first-degree rape.
Fernando Thomas. 19, a freshman from Georgetown, was arrested Tuesday night by UK Police for an incident, which occurred on campus on Oct. 15, 2001.
Thomas turned himself in to police and was held in the Fayette County Detention Center. As of Wednesday afternoon he was still in custody.

Many are optimistic that the damage caused by the Administration Building fire in May will lead to a better future. "(We want) to make it a building that was probably better than it ever was and that is fully functional and indicative of a new university," said Dennis Domer, a historic preserval.

At a lecture in Pence Hall Wednesday night, Charles Phillips, the preservation archi-tect working on the project, un-veiled the building's secrets.

carefully analyzing the building and was surprised with what he's unearhed. He found lessons from the 1920s on black-boards and antique wallpaper under layers of plaster. "If we don't retain evidence of what people have done in the past, then we don't know where to go in the future," he said. Other uses for the building were concluded as well. It used to house an infirmary and the Union Philosophical Literary Society.

Shooting rampage at law school kills 3

Shooting rampage at law school kills 3 GRUNDY, Va. — A law school student who had just been suspended went on a shooting spree at the Appalachian School of Law Wednesday, killing the dean, a professor and a student before he was wrested to the ground, school officials and witnesses and in the hall of gunfre. Dean L. Anthony Sutin and Professor Thomas Blackwell were gunned down in their offices, according to school officials. The third person slain was a student, said Ellen Qualla, a spokeswoman for Gov. Mark Warner. State police identified the suspect as 43-year-old Peter O dightzuma. Odightzuma had been suspended from school earlier Wednesday, Qualls said. She said Odightzuma had a history of mental instability that school officials were aware of. The suspect was at the Buchanan County Jail.

BOSTON — The airline passenger accused of trying to Ignite explosives in his shoes was indicted Wednesday on charges of being an al-Qaida-trained terrorist whose goal was to blow up the plane. Richard Reid, a 28-year-old British citzen, could get five life sentences if convicted. The indictment, issued by a federal grand jury in Boston, alleges Reid attempted to kill the 197 passengers and crew aboard a Parist-o-Miami American Airlines flight Dec. 22. Reid did "attempt to use a weapon of mass destruction ... consisting of an explosive bomb placed in each of his shoes," the indictment said. The indictment said Reid "received training from al-Qaida in Afghanistan." Compiled from wire reports







Integrity needed in Athletics Dept.

Two years from now the UK men's basketball team will be forced to take the floor against two of its table scraps, former head basketball coach Rick Pitino and former junior forward Marvin Stone. The controversy surrounding Stone's request for a transfer to Louisville overshadowed the Cats' on-the-court endeavors for a couple of shaky

Many people are raising questions regarding the move to grant Stone a transfer because of concerns about the type of precedent it could set in the future. Fans should in all likelihood, be minimal), but rather with the graceless way the Athletics Department handled the entire situation.

Athletics Director Larry Ivy initially pointed to an "unwritten" policy as justification for his decision to deny Stone's request. He explained that the policy prohibited athletic transfers to any Southeastern Conference school, as well as three non-conference opponents: Notre Dame, Indiana and Louisville.

After it was revealed that former UK athletes — like football player Donnell Gordon who transferred to U of L in 1995 — have in fact been granted releases in the past, Ivy was quick to change his tune.

Stone was allowed to seek a spot on Louisville's roster in addition to an athletic scholarship, and Ivy abandoned the beloved phantom policy, contending that the ultimate decision had rested with head basketball coach Tubby Smith. In the beginning, Ivy explained that Smith didn't want to have to suit his team up against a former teammate, but because of a change of heart Ivy decided to grant the transfer. Oddly, at the outset of the debacle Smith told the media he was happy that he didn't have to be a part of this particular decision.

The way this situation was handled points to a dire lack of professionalism in the learner way this his first prove department.


