



Upon returning to campus for the spring semester, students will need to acquire their textbooks quickly — making them dependent upon Wildcat Textbooks, the eCampus werehouse. Remeety's or UK Bookstore.

Optional books and books lacking ISBN numbers are not listed. This is a service that some uninversities provide their students. Textbooks for classes are listed on the Internet and students use the information to conveniently shop online.

UK does not currently offer this service because of an agreement reached with UK Bookstore. Carol Behtr, general manager of Kennedy's Bookstore, which owns and operates UK Bookstore, said the policy is to protect the university bookstore. 




