

State College, Mar. 11, 1892.
 Meeting called by President Patterson
 and the Faculty notified of the death
 of Capt. William V. Nicholas. Prof.
 Beville moved a committee of three
 be appointed to prepare resolutions
 expressing the feelings of the Faculty
 upon the death of Capt. Nicholas, for
 many years a trustee of the College and a
 member of its Executive Committee. Profs. Beville
 Sezell and Logan were appointed, and reported
 the following resolutions which were
 adopted:

1. Resolved, That the members of this Faculty
 on learning with unfeigned sorrow of the
 great loss sustained by the College and the com-
 munity, in the death of Capt. Nicholas,
 desire to testify to his long, faithful and efficient
 service as Trustee; to his extraordinary worth
 as man, citizen, and official; and particu-
 larly to the perfect integrity, the rare
 modesty, purity and gentleness that dis-
 tinguished his character, and made it
 at once so strong and yet so beautiful and
 attractive. As educators profoundly in-
 terested in all that can improve the young,
 we shall seldom be able to direct our
 students to so fine a model for their
 regard and imitation as was Capt. Nicholas.
 Given be his memory.

2. Resolved, That this Faculty in a body
 attend his funeral.

3. Resolved - That a record of these pro-
 ceedings be preserved in our book of min-
 utes, and that a copy thereof be sent to his
 family, and others, to the newspapers of
 Lexington for publication.
