To the Honorable the Judges of the District Court held in Lexington in Chancery sitting:
Humbly Complaining sheweth unto your Honors,
Your Orators, Thomas Meudenhall, and Jonathan Elliott, Elias Elliott, George Elliott and John Ellicott legal representatives of John and Andrew Ellicott who were assignees of the said Thomas Meudenhall and Israel Pleasants, Walter Franklin and Samuel R. Franklin Executors of the last will and testament of Thomas Franklin deceased, and John Wilson and Robert Boone and Edward Lawrence and Effingham Lawrence, executors of John Lawrence deceased, and Sarah Embree Executrix of the last will and testament of Lawrence Embury deceased and George Embree and Joseph Pearsall administrator of Mary Pearsall deceased, Effingham Embree, Edward Lawrence and Effingham Lawrence and Thomas Steab,

That a certain Abraham Fowler who your orators pray may be made a defendant to this bill, being indebted to the persons hereinafter named in the sums herein after mentioned (to wit)
