



Jamal Mashburn's return to exington wasn't scripted perfect-

ly.

After all, in a perfect world,
Mashburn would've scored 30
points and led his Dallas Mavericks to a win over the Chicago
Bulls in front of his former college
teammates, their coach and his
mother, Helen.

The player Dick Vitale deemed
The Monster Mash* during his
playing days at UK got those 30
points with UK coach Rick Pitino
and former teammates, including
Tony Delk, Jared Prickett and
Rodrick Rhodes looking on.
But the Mavericks lost to the
Bulls 121-103. And Helen Mashburn stayed in New York.
Still, her son was pleased not
only with his return visit, but also
with the improvement of his team,
which won only 13 of its 82 games
last season.

last season.

"It's always special to come back to the University of Kentucky, especially with the chance to play at Rupp Arena," said

Mashburn, who played for UK from 1991-93. "But seeing Coach Pitino in the stands and not on the sidelines, that was something different."

Mashburn received warm ova-tions for the slightest of good plays, and flashbulbs popped at his every move, including his nine free-throw attempts. And the second-year pro pro-vided plenty of photo opportuni-ties.

He sported new moves in the post, including a one-handed fall-away jumper that terrorized Chicago's Toni Kukoc more than a few times.



Israel agrees to resume talks with Palestinia

"We are sorry the Palestinian police protected the Israeli soldiers instead of us," said Mazen Salamah, a 21-year-old student.
Despite the disturbance, the Israeli Cabinet decided to lift a nearly weeklong closure on the Caza Strip as of today. The restrictions have prevented tens of thousands of Gazans from reaching jobs in Israel.

Rabin's spokesman, Benny Cohen, said the prime minister decided after the weekly Cabinet meeting to resume autonomy talks

Rabin as saying he hadn't intended to call off the talks, but only to summon the chief negotiator for

consultations.

Arafat declined comment after a meeting with aides in Gaza City, but Palestinian sources said privately that they would attend the talks.

Palestinian officials had urged Israel to resume talks, saying the suspension and the closing of Gaza played into the hands of extremists.

"Most students aren't aware of how much impact this research has on them," Editor Susan Stempel said. "The fact that a faculty member can secure a nationally reviewed research grant can be a determining factor on whether students, particularly graduate students, will attend the University."
