
Mrs. Harold Fine and Mrs. Ben Miller were welcomed as new members into Sisterhood.


"WHAT IS REFORM JUDAISM"

Mrs. James Strauss arranged the program and Mrs. Maurice Hymson the display.



On November 14 a seminar on Reform Judaism was conducted by Rabbi Louis Egelson of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations office in Cincinnati.



When the last issue of the Temple News went out at the end of May, the Temple had purchased the house and lot next door with the intention of using the house immediately as a Religious School Building, and of building an addition to the Temple on the lot some time in the future.

Much has happened since then and the Temple may now pride itself on the fact that a full-fledged building program is NOW in progress and has not been put off for the indefinite future.

The conscience of the Congregation realized that even if classes were held in the house our Religious School facilities would be inchessed.

inadequate.

It was, therefore, decided at a special Congregational meeting in June that we should build immediately, if possible with in a certain budgetary limitation.

The Temple Board purseued the matter further and arrangements are now being made for the construction of a new wing to house the Religious School. The kitchen facilities and the vestry will also be enlarged, since space in the vestry will no longer be needed for classrooms and offices. The house has been rented.

We regret that we must begin Religious School this year again with cramped facilities, but we look forward to great improvements when the new wing is completed. The Congregation owes its appreciation to those who conceived the plan and were active in bringing about its adoption.

For the time being four year olds will not be accepted.

Should there be a DEMAND FOR A FOUR YEAR OLD CLASS, it will be given consideration and an announcement will be made at a later date.



YOUR HELP IS REQUESTED FOR IMPORTANT LEGISLATION

The following is summary of a letter reteived by our Sisterhood from Mrs. Barckley Story, Chrmn. of the Welfare Committee, of the Lexington Federation of Church Women. Please read this and then express your interest in proper aid to mental hospitals on enclosed blank card, which is already addressed, and mail immediately!

"When the legislature convenes in January, they will be asked for additional funds for the mental hospitals in Kentucky. At the last regular session a budget was presented calling for \$2.98 per day per patient. The legislature cut this to \$.98 per day per patient, with inevitable and devastating results. The hospitals were understaffed. Patients received little treatment. Necessary equipment and medication was lacking. Only \$.01 per day was available for medical treatment. If anyone needed penicillin, insulin, or streptomycin, or sulfa drugs, it was just too bad! FOOD was inadequate. Nutritional needs are disregarded. Eggs are rare, and fruit juices almost unheard of. Milk and butter are served only once a day. With such a diet, the tubercular record is abysmal. Instead of curing the mentally ill, we add to their troubles with physical illness!!

We must convince our legislators that we are interested in seeing this corrected. It is our solemn obligation to inform them that we cannot condone the present manner of treatment of our 7500 mentally ill, and we wholeheartedly approve the \$3.00 per day per patient budget which will be presented within a few weeks."
