

SG approves referendum rules

SG approved the measure, putting tighter restrictions on how referendums and initiatives can be placed on student ballots.

Students hoping to place referendums or initiatives on ballots will face new limits after Student Government approved a constitutional amendment last night after lively debate. The statute, "The Student Government Initiative and Referendum Act," requires two week's notice, an explanation of intent and 1,000 signatures before any referendum or initiative can be presented to students for a vote. The act also limits the number of issues on a ballot to two referendums and two initiatives and was passed despite several senators' concerns with these limits.

The first two referendums and initiatives received by the Student Government Election Board of Supervision will be the ones presented to students on the ballot. "I am concerned that placing a cap

"I am concerned that placing a cap would prevent significant issues from being raised, delaying action for anoth-er year," said Graduate School Senator Jonica Burke, one of three senators to

where restrictions on how referendums and initiatives vote no on the issue who said she supported the statute as a whole but was concerned about the limit.

Senators may present amendments to senators may present amendments of the senators may present amendments. We can revisit portions of it and constantly tinker with it, "said Senate President Braphus Kaalund. "The basis of it is solid, even if parts need tinkering."

Several senators agreed with passing the statute in order to have some rules in place but may present changes within the next weeks.

"We need something to start with, and we have spent so much time on this one issue. Why are we wasting time on this when we can waste time on something else," asked College of Engineering Senator Joshua Odol. "We should work together on this Kaalund about the next steps to take to present an amendment to the full senate.

For the senate to consider an amendment, a senator would need to take initiative and write his or her own bill to present to the Committee on bill to present to the Committee on the committee on

Committees and the Operations and Evaluations Committee before it could be passed on for approval by the full senate, said Becky Ellingsworth, chairman of the operations and evaluations committee.

If a senator were to act quickly, an amendment could be presented to the Committee on Committees next Monday, the Operations and Evaluations Committee next Wednesday and move on to a full senate vote during their next meeting on Dec. 1, Ellingsworth said.

next meeting on Dec. 1, Ellingswortan said. Even if changes are made, they may not accurately reflect students' opinions, said Molly Glauber, director of multi-cultural affairs for Student Activities Board who attended the meeting.

"SG meetings are open to the public, and a lot of issues aren't publicized and scrutinized by the media, so it is important for students to see for themselves if their senators are representing their views," she said. "Students are doing themselves an injustice by not attending SG meetings."

Gonzalez to replace Ashcroft in Cabinet

WASHINGTON — In background and temperament, Alberto Gonzales, President Bush's choice to be attorney general, could hardly be more different from his predecessor, John Ashcroft.

Ashcroft, from Missouri, was the son and grandson of Assemblies of God ministers; Gonzales, 49, was reared in a Catholic Mexican-American family in Texas by parents who had been migrant farm workers.

Ashcroft was hard-charging and the ideological darling of religious conservatives; Gonzales, called "mi abogado" (my lawyer) by Bush, is soft-spoken, nondogmatic and viewed with suspicion by conservatives.

Ashcroft was a Missouri governor and senator and even attempted a run

for the presidency in his three decades in politics; Gonzales was a Houston business lawyer with no political career before he was recruited in 1994 by Bush's gubernatorial campaign.

As White House counsel in Bush's first term, Gonzales, who followed Bush to Washington, was known less for his ideology than his loyatiy to Bush, Indeed, he could be politically the bush to the political that the political that the political state of the political that the political state of the political that the political state of the polit

Arafat dies; leaders debate funeral plans

there. Until he flew to France for medical treatment on Oct. 29, Arafat had not
left the compound in 21/2 years.
Arafat slipped into a coma after his
arrival at the Percy Military Training
Hospital in Clamart, a suburb of Paris,
and on Tuesday he developed a brain
hemorrhage Leila Shahid, a Palestinian envoy, told France-Info radio

wednesdy that Arafat was in the "final phase" of his life.

Taissir Dayut Tamimi, a senior Islamic cleric who heads the religious courts in the Palesthian territories, arcuit in the palesthian the Quant at Arafat's bedside and was ready, if the Palesthian leader died, to prepare his body according to Islamic custom, Erekat said.

Before visiting Arafat, Tamimi told reporters at the hospital, "As long as there is a manifestation of life present, from movement to temperature in the body, then he is alive." Removing Arafat from life-support machines, he said, would be "forbidden under Islamic law."

When he emerged from the hospital, the cleric said, "I spent more than one hour next to the president and he is alive and well... Yes, he is sick, and the stutution is critical, but he is alive."

But Israel has controlled the city since annexing its eastern half after the 1967 Middle East war, and Prime Minister Ariel Sharon — who often refers to

Jerusalem as Israel's eternal, undivided capital — ruled out any burial for Arafat in "greater Jerusalem," which refers to the city and neighborhoods surrounding it.

The choice of a burial site in Ramallah, which is about five miles north of Jerusalem, resolves a contentious issue between Israelis and Palestinians. On Wednesday, buldozers and dump trucks were clearing and cleaning Arafat's compound, known as the Muqata, of old cars, barrels filled with cement and other objects strewn around as a defense against Israeli incursions.

The decision to hold a formal state funeral in the Egyptian capital — where Arafat was born, although he often claimed Jerusalem as his birthplace — also resolves several potentially thorny issues, particularly whether leaders of countries that do not recognize Israel would visit an area under Israeli occupation, and if they did, whether Palestinian security Forces could guarantee their security.

Erekat said a delegation of Palestinians was scheduled to fly to Egypt on Wednesday night to discuss details of a funeral, but that the general outline had been decided.

Also being debated is the future of Palestine — no clear successor to Arafat has been named.

Q&A with Steve Voss

Political science professor



Opinions editor Andrew Martin sat down with political science professor Steve Voss to discuss the aftermath of the Nov. 2 election.

How accurate were the polls leading up to the presidential election?

election?

A. Well, the polls gave horrible predictions on who would win the election, especially the exit polls. But you have to keep in mind that until the final days before the election, voters may not have a real good idea how they're going to vote.

That doesn't mean the polls were inaccurate. They may have been giving an accurate sense of where voter's minds were when they were taken. The later people decide, the harder it's going to be for polls to predict accurately what the outcome is going to be.

Now, the exit polls don't have any of those problems because they're talking about people coming out of precincts who already know how they voted, so there's no changing their mind after the poll has been

What about the youth vote? There was a lot of talk about them throwing the election to Kerry because they would heavily favor him and cannot be polled easily because they carry cell phones in lieu of having a landline telephone.

It's true that cell phone users are hard to poll. And it's also true that more young voters were supportive of Kerry than the average voter But anybody who tells me that cell phone users are overwhelmingly Democratic I think does not have their finger on the pulse of young voters.

For one thing, cell phones cost money, What's the one thing we know about cell phone users? Well, they have enough money to buy a cell phone. And what do we know cell phone, and what cell phone compared to the average person who has less money.

The young are more Kerry-oriented. I haven't seen any evidence that cell phone users were more Kerry-oriented.

The young were always hard to poll. If you look at articles written on survey methodology in the '80s and early '90s before cell phones really became an issue, they tell you the young are undersampled. You shouldn't expect the growth of cell phones to necessarily cause the bias

to be greater than it was before.

There have been all these get out the vote efforts for young people. Yet it doesn't appear that they voted in any higher numbers than in 2000.

The evidence I've seen has been mixed. I've been trying to get my finger on the truth of this, whether young voters did or did not turn out more.

I do know that even the people saying that the young did not turn out to vote more were still saying they did turn out to vote more in the swing states. Well, that's where the mobilization efforts were concentrated, and that's where they had the most incentive to turn out.

Do you think we should do away with exit polls?

I think exit polls are ex-tremely useful in understanding the outcome of an election when you can see how young people voted, how men and women voted or how people to yote which is a very blunt instru-ment, become a little more focused and settled as a way of communicat-ing with government.

ing with government.

That's taking the polls and having the data. There's something different when you start taking about releasing predictions about what happens in the election based on those polls before votting has stopped. And yes, I think that declaring exit polls and the release of that data to be interference with a fair election, and banning predictions before polls have closed in every state, I would have no problem with that.

of press?

... Well, your First Amendment rights get compromised. They get compromised. They get compromised. For example, to ensure a fair trial. There's nothing more fundamental in a democracy than a fair election. If people are releasing selective information that they purport to be election results, that interferes with the fairness of the election. Then it's not clear to me that that's a free speech violation unless you're willing to allow inaccurate results to be considered libel.

If you want to say. "OK, well this fails under the First Amendment. We have free speech rights to do it, but if we harm your reputation or other-

Anytime Americans have a close election there is talk about eliminating the Electoral College. What are the pros and cons of that?

Well, one pro of eliminating the Electoral College would be we have a strong belief in equality and a strong belief in one person, one vote. Another benefit is that elections would be much more transparent.

ent. so would be much more transpar-ent.

Personally, I find those argu-ments unpersuasive. I think the costs of eliminating the Electoral College would be much more severe than the benefits we gain.

Here are the things we have dis-covered about voting that make the Electoral College a much more useful institution than most people realize:

No. 1, the Electoral College dis-courages divisive sectional appeals by requiring a presidential candidate to stitch together a coalition across a wide geographical area. That's help-ful.

We may not like having presiden-

We may not like having presiden-tial candidates appeal to lowa, Ohio or Floridasu appeal to lowa, Ohio or Floridasu present to the petitive because they re diverse, and that means that candidates still have to appeal to a diverse voting pool.

Take away the state-hystate structure of the election and they'll start appealing to distinct voting blocs. That's much more divisive.

No 2. if you get rid of the Electoral College, the vote in every precinct will start to matter. Because any place you can get a vote matters. When we have a close election, instead of being able to focus on a couple of states and what they did, every single precinct and its procedures and any improprieties will suddenly be politicized.

Instead of being able to fease on.

and any impropercies with someone be politicized.

Instead of being able to focus on Florida and Ohio, the imperfect procedures across the country will suddenly become an issue.

Take that away and the vote in heavily Democratic or Republican places start to matter. And the incentive to distort vote totals will go up in exactly the places where you'll most likely have people willing to do it.

Proximity to campus no problem with new proxy

Tackling papers and projects is headache enough without having to deal with technology issues.

Students looking for information and sources once had to use campus computers or set up complicated proxy servers on dicampus computers to use resources from the WT. Young Library.

With the library's new proxy service that's not the case anymore — students can access the library resources on any computer with their student identification number.

The newer proxy service doesn't make

any new options available, but it simplifies accessing what the library already had. Even such a small change can make a bug difference for students.

"The old one just didn't work well all the time and it was not flexible when it came to the variety of users," said Rob Aken, electronic resources librarian.

The older server worked especially poorly with Internet Explorer, but now it doesn't matter what Web browser students unumber.

Aken said the process of switching to the new proxy service took six months, and

More than any other indicator, students and staff have had fewer problems operating the new system, Vickery said.

"There are far fewer problems than with the last one," he said. "The problems people do have, we can almost always find solutions for. That was definitely not the case with the old proxy."

That's good news for students who would rather spend time wrestling with their assignments than with their computer access. The university made a great decision in switching, and we can all expect to benefit from the change the rest of the year.
