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The report of the Elections Committee for 1961 was presented by Professor Staley Adams, Chairman, and approved by the University Faculty.

President Frank G. Dickey

Dear President Dickey:

The current election of members of the University Faculty has been completed and the results are hereby certified. The members elected are listed by their respective groups together with their term of office.

In this election, there were increases in representatives of one in Home Economics, one in Nursing, one in Dentistry, and eight in Medicine.

In planning the election the committee considered a matter which it felt came within its prerogative.

Staggering the terms of the newly elected members into periods of three, two, and one years in order to re-establish balance within each college or group. The length of the term in each instance was determined by the number of votes received.

Literature, Philosophy and Arts

President Dickey extended a cordial welcome to the newly elected members of the Faculty.

Dr. Scherago presented the proposed University Calendar for 1962-63. After discussion and two amendments to the Calendar the motion was made and approved that action on the proposed Calendar as presented be postponed to the November Faculty meeting and that it be referred back to the Schedule Committee for consideration of the proposals and amendments that had been projected in the discussion.

Dean Wall presented resolutions on the death of Dr. James H. Martin, former staff member of the Kentucky Agricultural Experiment Station. The Chairman called for a moment of silent prayer in acceptance of the resolutions.

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DR. JAMES H. MARTIN

The University of Kentucky colleagues of Dr. James H. Martin and his many friends throughout the city and state were greatly saddened by his death on August 3, 1961.

Dr. Martin first became a member of the Kentucky Agricultural Experiment Station staff in 1909 as a Drug Inspector in the Food and Drug Division. He was the first Drug Inspector employed in Kentucky. He remained in this post for two years and returned again in 1923 as Assistant Chemist in the Public Service Laboratory. He worked continuously as a chemist until he was given change-of-work status in 1941. He was recalled to duty in 1943 and worked until July 1, 1950. He continued to work part time as Acting Drug Chemist until 1954. From then until his death, he continued on change-of-work status.

Dr. Martin was born in Mason County, Kentucky, October 13, 1871. He received the PhG Degree from Philadelphia College of Pharmacy in 1892. He operated Martin's Drug Store in Winchester from 1892 through 1914.

For two years he worked for the U. S. Duty & Company of Winchester. Following this he traveled for the E. S. Squibb & Sons in sales and promotion work in the state of Kentucky.

He was active in all affairs pertaining to pharmacy and drugs in the state from the time he opened his drug store in Winchester through the remainder of his life. He served on the Kentucky Board of Pharmacy, was a member of the American Chemical Society and the Association of Official Agricultural Chemists. He was a member of the Elks Club in Winchester. He served on the Winchester Board of Education and was an active member of the First Christian Church in Winchester.

Dr. Martin's work as a drug chemist was most outstanding. During the period of his service he was the only such chemist in this section. It was his duty to work on many poison cases. He testified frequently as a witness in court as a result of his findings.

He was devoted to his family and recognized by his many friends as a most gracious gentleman with a pleasing personality.

It is with the deepest feeling of sorrow that the passing of this friend and associate is noted.

Dean Shaver presented a recommendation from the College of Engineering for change in content and number of credits of EE 211 which was approved by the Faculty.

EE 211 INTRODUCTION TO ELECTRICAL ENGINEERING (3) I, II, S

Fundamental laws and principles; interpretations, physical concepts; background for linear analysis study. Prerequisite: MA 113. Concurrent: Phy. 231. Daily.

This course was originally taught for one credit.

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Dr. Kuiper, Chairman of the Faculty Program Committee, presented Dr. Frank D. Peterson, Vice President, Business Administration, who had been invited to speak to the group about the proposed University budget for instruction and research. With the aid of charts, Dr. Peterson presented the allocation of University funds for the past three years. His presentation included a comparison of the percentage of our budget spent on teaching and research activities with the percentage spent by all land-grant universities as well as certain selected institutions. During the brief question period a desire was expressed for additional time to be devoted to questions. Dr. Peterson indicated that he would be happy to discuss the budget whenever the Faculty invited him to do so. Dr. Dickey thanked Dr. Kuiper and his Committee for planning the program and Dr. Peterson and his staff for presenting the information.
