Dear Aunt Lilla, -

Well I believe they say 32 years ago the snows were over the fences in Escaflon are they this spring.

I wish you could see my new home I have got moved a gain we have bought 160 a. of unimproved land way, way off away from every body 40 mi. from Jamez. we have got a one roomed cabin partly build it is 12 ft. by 16 ft. I haven't any stove here yet but expect Frank will bring one to day. we are in a oil country there is a chance of our making some money here in a year or two it looks now like a chance of a life time our land is all good land. There isn't a house or a tree in sight. Herds of cattle are every where around us and lots of herds of sheep near. We had to draw our lumber 40 miles

and also our furniture. Any wood I have to burn is sage brush it makes good wood only it is small. have been doing my cooking since I came here in a hole dug in the ground.

I have about 3¹/₂ doz. hens with me. my two dogs and one of them has 5 little puppies the old dogs kill rattle snakes they killed one when we came over and I think they did another one it was so large they couldn't lift it from the ground there are a lots of them around here and centipedes and tarantulas and scorpions they are all very poisonous if they bite me I have killed two centipedes they are horrid looking things have lots of legs and joints. There are two other families that have got land a bout a mile from us that we got acquainted with before we came down here. We can see hills all around us but they don't have any trees on them. We have 4 mares and 3 are going to have little colts one of them had one the eleventh of this month there we had one last year so we shall

have 8 horse kind before the summer is out.

My folks are all well but James he had a hard cold when I came away but Thursday papa came down with us he is going to get some land near us I expect! He has one big mare she has a nice colt and James expects 3 and a male colt Papa says he feels 10 years younger than he did when he came to Cal. Earl is staying with James folk to finish out his school.

We have to bring all of our water 2 miles how is that.

Earl had three banties given to him a while ago a rooster and two little hens they are both laying nicely.

I have to shut my hens up every night so the ^{coyotes} ~~coyotes~~ cant get them.

If fresh air is good for folks we out here ought to be well my house is so small I have to do lots of my work out doors now I am sitting in our carriage writing Beulah is trying to play a tune with a knife on the kettles and spiders that are

hung on the out side of the house.
There has been a fine breeze every since
I have been out here so we don't seem
to mind the heat yet and people around
say there all ways is a good breeze.
I can see smoke from 2 oil wells and
they have got oil rigs set up on the
hill sides all around us.

There is a lady staying here with
me for a few day that came from
North Carolina when she was a little
girl in a train.

Have you got done sugaring yet if
you haven't eat a good lot for me.
Well I can't think of any thing more
