

State University Mar 27 - 1908.

The faculty met in Prof. Miller's room at 3:30 P.M. those present being Pres. Patterson, Prof. J. G. White, Patterson, W. H. Poyar, Anderson, Mathews, Miller, Pease, Mackenzie, Nowood, Corbiner, Wilson, Little, Embrod, Rowe, Frankel, Mrs. Neumann and Miss Marshall.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

The Com. on extramural requirement for the 2 yr. short courses reported progress and asked for further time. On motion of Prof. Mackenzie seconded by Prof. Frankel, it was ordered that this com. be given power to act in relation to the extramural requirement for the 2 yr. courses in agriculture and engineering, in order to facilitate the publication of the catalog.

Prof. Miller presented the report of the committee on revision of schedules, etc. following this with a detailed explanation of the proposed schedule for the A.B. and B.S. degrees.

1. The Com. recommends that in the main, the plan of two and three hour class periods per week be adopted in place of the 5 periods per week, in accordance with schedule shown.
2. The Com. recommends that a minimum of sixty four units of credit be required of each student for the degree of B.S. or A.B. (a unit of credit being given for a one hour lecture, or recitation per week throughout a college year, or its equivalent) - two hours of laboratory or field work being equal in value to a one hour lecture or recitation.

Further, that no student be permitted to take more than twenty class periods per week.

3. The com. recommends that no change be made in the present three term arrangement, but that the work heretofore set

at the close of the Winter Term apart for examinations, be discontinued, and that no examinations be given during this week except such as can be given by any department during its own close period, or at such other times as will not interfere with the class work of other departments.

Upon motion of C.W. Mathews seconded by Prof. Anderson it was ordered that this faculty recommend to the Board of Trustees that the report of the com. with the general plan of the schedule shown, be adopted, subject to such minor changes as experience may show to be desirable.

Upon motion of Prof. Gambrod, seconded by Prof. Anderson it was ordered that Prof. Miller be requested to present the report to the Board of Trustees as he has done to the faculty.

May. Corbusier called attention to the difficulty of securing regularity in attendance upon military drill and presented a set of regulations designed to overcome this difficulty.

After an extended discussion, in which various plans were proposed it was ordered on motion of Prof. Anderson, seconded by Prof. Wilson, that delinquencies in Mil. Drill and in gymnasium be made up during the same week in which they occur or that otherwise the student be debarred from all class privileges until such delinquencies are made up.

Prof. Patterson announced that greatly to his regret, Prof. J. G. White had found it necessary to resign the Deanship of the Scientific faculty, and that he had appointed Prof. Am. Miller, Dean pro tem. until the meeting of the Board of Trustees.

The meeting adjourned.
