Senate allots travel money

Controversial group receives money for trip

Senators were at each other's throats over funding when UK Promise Keepers came before the Student Government Association's Appropriations and Revenue Committee on Sept. 15.

On Wednesday night, senators gave strong opinions for and against a bill to send 105 men to Washington, D.C., for Promise Keepers' Stand in the Gap' gathering on Oct. 4, but after 90 minutes of discussion senators voted 14-13 in favor of the bill.

The organization originally asked for \$3,748 for six van rentals and gas for seven vehicles. Senators amended it to \$1,648 after Social Work Senator George Myers suggested that each student yas \$20 to reduce the cost.

SGA President Melanie Cruz reminded senators that she has until Wednesday to either sign over the bill. She said she plans to make a "rational" decision.

UK Promise Keepers had been registered as a student organization once again went before the Sept. 15.

At nine days old the organization once again went before the senate, which had a barrage of questions it wanted answered about the trip and the national organization.

Nationally, Promise Keepers has received a reputation as a white, male, Christian, right-wing organization. UK Promise Keepers President Josh Walton, however, said his group is not affiliated with the nationals, nor does it plan to do so. He said the group intends to change its name once it returns from its trip.

Seminar: Gambling is never a safe bet

There is a silent assassin stalking the world of collegiate sports. It robs it of athletes, insults athletic departments and drags school pride through the mud. It can take the form of point shaving, or athletes betting on their own team, but it is known by one name—gambling.

own team, but it is known by one name — gambling.

The UK athletic department considered these factors when it began a series of seminars on sports wagering. The gatherings are mandatory for all UK student athletes, and the intent is to lay out the NCAA's stand on student-athletic gambling. According to the NCAA rule book, all athletes and athletic department staff members are prohibited from wagering on any NCAA sponsored event.

"It is an overall problem, a very serious problem," Athletic Director C.M. Newton said. "I made the decision that I had to have someone come to talk about gambling in general, and as an addiction."

Anyone not convinced of the dilemma can take a look at the statistics. A study of 2,000 student-athletes showed 25 percent had illegally bet on a sporting event, and 4 percent had bet on a game that they had played. Three even admitted to intentionally changing the outcome of their games.

Last night's guest speakers Newton included Bill Saum, who was recently appointed to the NCAA gambling task force and FBI agent Mike Welch, who specializes in organized crime.

"You can never forget that you are recognized as an athlete," Saum said. "We (athletes) need to evaluate relationships, notice the questions people are asking us and remember the team we represent."

Both Saum and Welch stressed

we represent."

Both Saum and Welch stressed that illegal wagering by athletes can affect their professional future and the severity of the consequences. Welch said that gambling doesn't stop at the sports bookie — the wagering link goes all the way to organized crime.

Hopefully UK athletes won't have the chance to get trapped in the quick-

sand of sports wagering, Welch said. Getting the information to athletes before illegal activity occurs is the most effective way of preventing the problem. "The most vulnerable people in the gambling society are college athletes," he said. "It is far better to know about these activities before you (athletes) have a chance to take part of them."

UK hoopster Cameron Mills said there isn't a problem within the UK athletic program, but the seminar was a great way to prevent an uprising. "As easy as it is to break an NCAA rule these days, you have to have things like this," Mills said. "I think it's a good idea to get us all together so we have a basic idea of what's going on."



Cats may learn big lesson: Speed kills

"This is the greatest chance in the world coming up Saturday," UK offensive tackle Jonas Liening said. "Playing Florida at home, the No. 1 team in the nation on live television in front of millions and millions of people."

Center Jason Watts echoed similar thoughts.

"Only a few people get to play the No. 1-ranked team in the nation," Watts said. "This is our Super Bowl. (Winning) will make probably the majority of the people on this team's career."

One ingredient that will not be missing are the big-time, big-play individuals on both sidelines. Last year, UF wide out Jacquez Green returned two UK punts for touchdowns in a three-minute span of the third quarter. Catching the majority of quarterback Doug Johnson's passes is Green, the third leading receiver in the SEC (96 yards per game) behind the Cats' Kio Sanford who is second with 99.3 ypg. "auguez is really a big-time

with 99.3 ypg.

"Jaquez is really a big-time receiver with tremendous hands for a little guy (5-foot-9 168 pounds)," Spurrier said of his star

receiver. "He's got all the qualities you look for."

As a senior playing in his fourth and final game against UF, Sanford said the UK offense is the most important thing to concentrate on, nor the swarming Gator defense.

"We've just got to go out there and just play our game; don't worry about what they're doing and what's going on with UF, Sanford said.

In eight games against No. 1-ranked opponents, UK is 2-6 with its last victory coming in 1964 against Ole Miss in Jackson, Miss. The Cats have never defeated a No. 1-ranked team at home.

"We're very fortunate that it is here in Lexington," Mumme said. We have all these great people in the Commonwealth to turn out and help us."

Possible equation: New excitement surrounding UK football plus home field advantage equals a victory by the blue and white.

But before anyone entertains the thought of carrying a goal post out of the stadium, the UK players all agreed that a rambunctious crowd Saturday will help make what used to be a dream become a reality.

"Hopefully our fans will stay loud to where it's hard for them to concentrate and keep them out of the game," Watts said.

"We've got to build off the intensity from the crowd," Sanford said. "That'll help us play better."





Forum: **Black AIDS** cases up

The second annual African-American HIV/AIDS Conference Saturday morning began with a heartfelt story from Geraldine E. Martin, whose son suffers from AIDS.

The conference, held in the Hyart Regency's Patterson Ballroom downtown, included a panel of individuals infected with HIV or AIDS. The purpose of the meeting, however, was to raise awareness of sobering statistics that show cases of AIDS and HIV, the virus that causes AIDS, are increasing in the black community. Jim Titus, State HIV minority initiatives coordinator, presented the statistics in his speech titled "Where Do We Go From Here?"

Titus displayed graphics that showed while whites have the highest number of victims per total population, the numbers among blacks are siring. From 1990-06, the number of black AIDS cases newly diagnosed each year has risen steadily from 37 to 90 cases.

As of March 31, blacks composed seven per-cent of Kentucky's population. Twenty-six per-cent of Sentucky's population.

704 of state HIV cases can be attributed to blacks.

Of those, 49 percent of black males contracted the virus through male to male sexual contact, while 44 percent of black females contracted it through heterosexual contact.

"Again, the numbers tell us this is not a 'gay white man's disease. So where do we go from here? The answer is simple: We stop having unprotected sex," said Tixus, who quoted an African proverh: "It is best to bind up the finger before it is cut.

"If we are having sex... use latex. And we stop using needles which are not sterile. If we are

City eliminates parking spaces

"The warnings are to make sure the studenthat park there are aware of the change and get the vehicles moved before the city begins tricketing and towing," he said.

Thornton said he wasn't sure why the city made its decision, but the change had been proposed for years, In some case, he said, cars on the street can impair visibility for drivers eating adjacent lots.

Though Big Blue eventually captured the match 3-1, its the team's on-again, off-again play which has Flory puzzled.


"Traditionally, this is a 'bail out in the second game' kind of team," Flory said. "It seems like for every emotional high we have, we always have an emotional low."





At the beginning of the film, a woman is in the men's room (gent's room actually) urinating while standing. Men strip for money, which is not usually something seen on film. The women act moreso like men during the strip show (called "Hot

Metal" because most of them are ex-steelworkers), hooting and hollering.

Robert Carlyle, formerly of *Trainspotting* fame (he was Begbie) is not only the star of the film, but he also steals the entire

film, but he also steals the entire show.

Gaz and Dave (the aforementioned fat guy) both draw the viewer's synaphties. Dave yo-yos in and out of the show because he's a "fat bastard," and Gaz givesnumerous tender moments as the situation with his son become more heated.

The Full Monty neither overdoes nor underdoes the humory and gets its laughs without abuse of stereotypes or overused gags. What it does accomplish is being an original, well-made comedy, about men who wish to be accepted for their dreams, or rather despite them.
