Prof. Patterson explained ^{his} vote as follows:

"I am opposed to readmitting on any
condition any person who is guilty of the
offense of which this man has been
convicted, I, therefore, vote no."

The propriety of dismissing classes and sections
promptly as required by the regulations was then
discussed.
