JULIAN M. CARROLL

**Governor of the
Commonwealth of Kentucky**

JULIAN MORTON CARROLL became Kentucky's 58th governor on December 28, 1974, succeeding Wendell H. Ford, who was elected to the U. S. Senate. Carroll then won a full four-year term in the 1975 general election. Born in McCracken County in 1931, he attended Paducah Junior College after graduating from Heath High School. He was graduated from the University of Kentucky in 1954 and received his law degree from UK in 1956. Before becoming governor, Carroll served three years as lieutenant governor and ten years as a member of the Kentucky House of Representatives. He is an active member of the Optimist Club and a former Jaycee. He attained the highest office in Kentucky for laymen of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church in 1966-67 when he was named moderator of the Kentucky Synod. The Governor and his wife, Charlann, have four children.

H. FOSTER PETTIT

**Mayor
Lexington-Fayette
Urban County Government**

H. FOSTER PETTIT served two years as mayor of the City of Lexington and was a leader in the consolidation of the city and county governments. He was elected mayor of the Urban County Government in November 1973.

President of the Kentucky Municipal League for 1976, Mayor Pettit is also active with the U. S. Conference of Mayors and the National League of Cities. He was awarded the Optimist Cup in 1976 and the Chamber of Commerce Citizen-of-the-Year citation for 1975.

As chief executive of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, the mayor is authorized to supervise, administer and control all departments of government.

The mayor is elected on a non-partisan basis every four years. He is responsible for the proper administration of all services of the government. He is assisted principally by the Chief Administrative Officer and commissioners of the six departments.

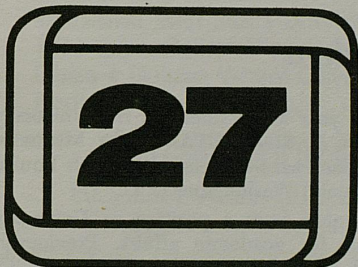
A native of Lexington, he is an attorney who served three terms as a state representative. He resides on Richmond Road with his wife, Marion, and four sons.

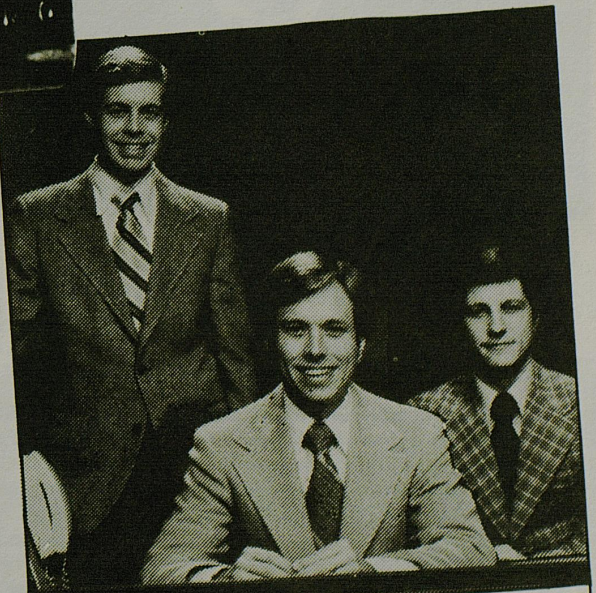
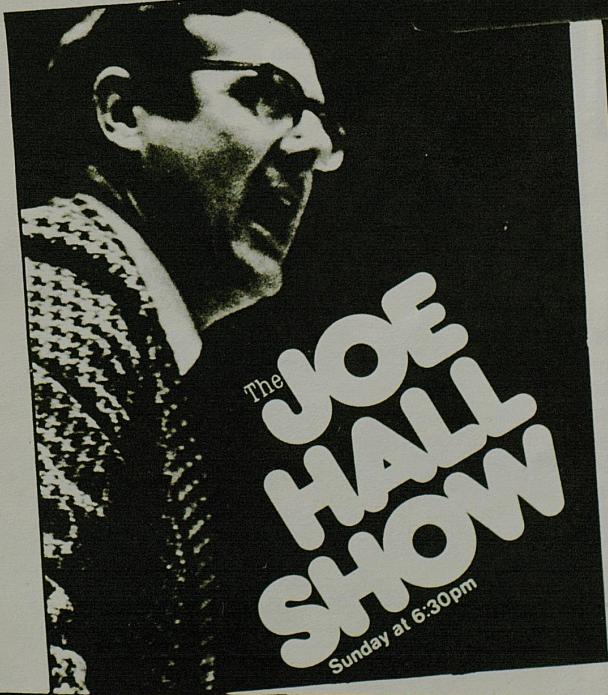

Dr. Otis A. Singletary
University of Kentucky President



Now in his eighth year as president of the University of Kentucky, **DR. OTIS A. SINGLETARY** is a Mississippian whose route to the Bluegrass State curled through Louisiana, Texas, North Carolina and Washington, D. C.

He came to Lexington from a position as University of Texas vice-chancellor for academic affairs. Previously, in Washington, he had been director of the U. S. Job Corps in the early stages of its development before moving to the American Council on Education as vice-president. He had gone to the capital in 1964 after three years as chancellor of the University of North Carolina at Greensboro.

The UNC appointment terminated Dr. Singletary's first association with the University of Texas, this a seven-year stay that saw him, as a young historian, rise rapidly in rank from instructor to full professor and begin the shift to administrative work, first as associate dean and later as assistant to the president.

The Kentucky president, and his wife—the former Gloria Walton, met when both were students at Millsaps College. He later earned master's and doctoral degrees at Louisiana State. The Singletarys have two daughters, Bonnie and Kendall, and a son, Scott.

Cliff Hagan
Director of Athletics

"I've been preparing for this all my life," **CLIFF HAGAN** said before taking over as athletics director at the University of Kentucky in 1975. Hagan succeeded Harry Lancaster as director after serving as assistant director for three years.

Hagan's path to the athletics directorship began in Owensboro, Kentucky, where he established a then state high school tournament record of 41 points in leading Owensboro to victory over Lafayette in the championship game of the 1949 state high school tournament.

At UK, he played on teams that won 86 of 91 games and an NCAA championship (1951). The 1954 team, undefeated in 25 games, elected not to participate in the national tournament.

Joe B. Hall

*University of Kentucky Wildcats
Head Basketball Coach*

JOE B. HALL'S record as Wildcat head coach for the past four years stands at 79-36. During the 1976 season his team won the National Invitational Tournament and ended the year with a 20-10 record.

Hall became No. 1 varsity assistant and head freshman Coach to Rupp after Harry C. Lancaster was named permanent athletic director Feb. 1, 1969. His record with the freshmen was 60-15, including an undefeated (22-0) season (1971-72) which resulted in the Kittens being crowned National Freshman Champions by the Basketball News.

During his first season as head coach, the Wildcats won their last nine conference games to sew up the SEC title.

His ten-year coaching record is 155-92. Broken down, it shows a 57-50 five-year mark at Regis, a 19-6 record at Central Missouri, and a 79-36 four-year record at Kentucky.

A popular personality on the clinic and convention circuits, Hall also has had much international exposure. In addition to the Globetrotters tour in 1951, and the "Down Under" tour in 1974, he has helped conduct basketball clinics for the U.S. Army in Anchorage and Fairbanks, Alaska (1968) and at Ramstein Air Base in Frankfurt, Germany and the RAF Base at Mildenhall, England in 1975. He also was Olympic Trials coach under Hank Iba at the Air Force Academy in July 1972 and is a member of the 1976 Olympic Basketball Committee.

PARSONS**

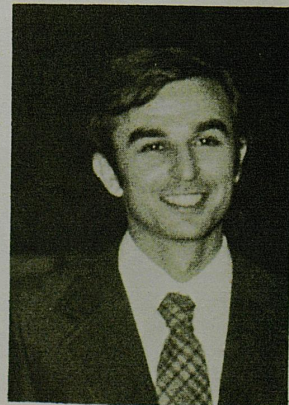

A native of Detroit, Michigan **JIM LONG** joined the UK staff last year as junior varsity coach and scout. In addition to his coaching duties, Long lends his talents to recruiting, scouting and directing UK's summer basketball camp.





ROY DON WILSON
Trainer

Entering his seventh year at UK is **ROY DON WILSON**, who came to the University after serving two years as trainer at The Citadel. A native of Texas, he is a graduate of Amon Carter Riverside High in Fort Worth. He received his B.S. degree from Texas A & M with a major in physical education and a minor in business. He is married to the former Patricia Jane Cotter of Houston. They have a son and a daughter.



WALT McCOMBS
Trainer

Returning to UK after a three-year absence during which he served in a similar capacity at Clemson University is **WALT McCOMBS**. Assigned primarily to basketball, McCombs also works with Wilson on the football field. A native of Belton, S. C., McCombs is a graduate of Parker High School and a 1971 graduate of The Citadel, where he was student trainer for four years. He was assistant trainer at UK in 1972 and '73. He is married to the former Shelby Burris of Belton.

Ten Schools Comprise Southeastern Conference

The Southeastern Conference traces its origin to 1933 when 13 members of the old Southern Conference reorganized into a new conference made up of Southern schools located west and south of the Appalachian Mountains.

The 13 charter members of the SEC were (listed alphabetically): Alabama, Auburn, Florida, Georgia, Georgia Tech, Kentucky, Louisiana State, Mississippi, Mississippi State, Sewanee, Tennessee, Tulane, and Vanderbilt. Since that time, three members have left the conference: Sewanee in 1940; Georgia Tech in 1964; and Tulane in 1966.

The ten schools in the SEC compete each year for conference championships in football, basketball, baseball, track, tennis, golf, swimming, and wrestling. In addition, an all-

sports trophy is given to the member compiling the most points in all sports, with 10 points given for a first-place finish, nine for second, and so on.

The office of Commissioner of the SEC was created in 1940 because of the growing demands for administering the conference's business. The first Commissioner was Martin S. Conner of Jackson, Miss., who served until 1946. Bernie H. Moore, former coach at L.S.U., was Commissioner until 1966 and was responsible for guiding the SEC to national prominence.

A. M. (Tonto) Coleman succeeded Moore, serving until 1972 when the present Commissioner, Dr. H. Boyd McWhorter, took office.

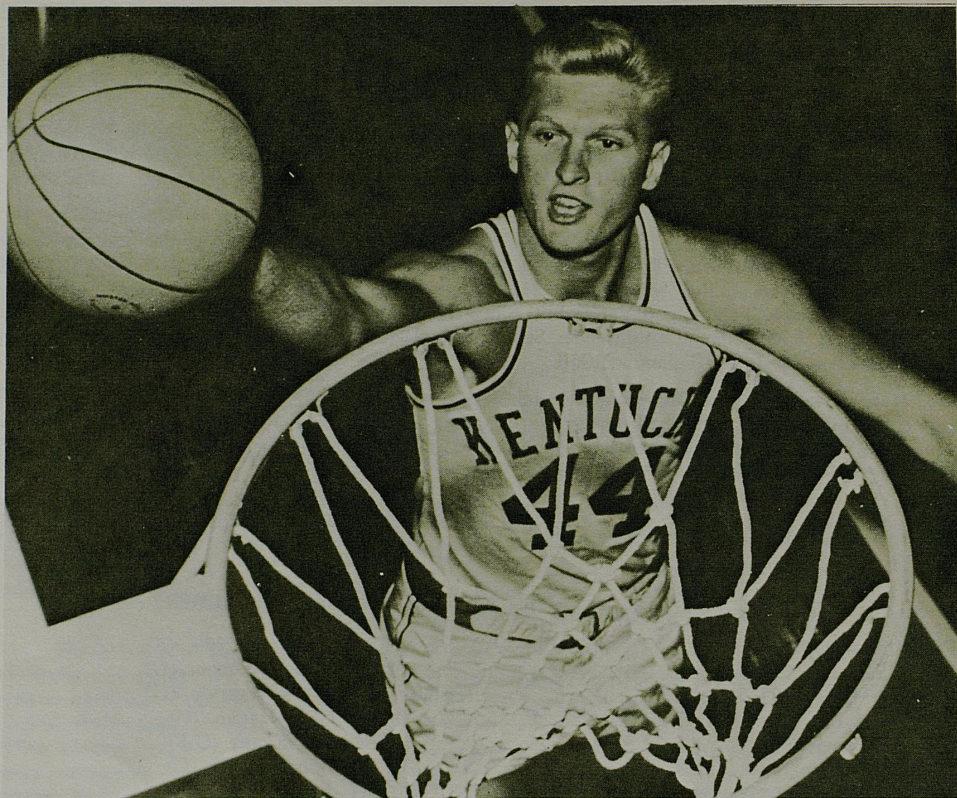

Wildcats Of The Past

**CHARLES
"COTTON"
NASH
1962-64**



Charles "Cotton" Nash wore Wildcat jersey No. 44 during the seasons of 1962, 63, and 64. He was the third highest scorer in UK history—with a total of 1,770 points and an average of 22.69 in 78 games. He achieved membership in the 1,000 Point Club earliest of any Wildcat, hitting his 1,000 point in the 19th game of his junior year.

Cotton's high school basketball coach for two years in Charlestown, Indiana was Cliff Barker, a member of UK's "Fabulous Five." Shortly thereafter the Nash family moved to Louisiana and Cotton began to break all the records at Lake Charles High School. He was a unanimous Louisiana all-star selection twice in basketball and All-State twice in football. He broke the state discus record, was courted by major league baseball scouts and was the unanimous choice of the Louisiana Sports Writers Association as the top athlete there in 1960.

In his freshman year at Kentucky (1960-61) the UK Fact Book says of him, "Big (6'5"), rugged, smart and a terrific basketball player, Cotton Nash was the number one school-boy cage prospect of the country last winter. Courted by 34 colleges and universities, Nash was personally signed by Coach Rupp."

Also that year UK signed Kentuckians Ted Deeken and Tommy Harper, Paul Wyatt of Milford, Utah and George Critz of Bellbrook, Ohio.

Cotton tells Russell Rice, UK's Sports Information Director in "Big Blue Machine":

"Basically the thing that impressed me was the efficiency of the operation. There was an old clock on the Coliseum wall that clicked off the minutes. The big hand would lumber and clump. When it hit 3:14 or 3:15, there was suddenly a different atmosphere. Everybody knew exactly what to do. We didn't practice over one hour and 45 minutes, but we got things done. It was like a well-run business. I enjoyed that part of it most.

"We never came into the dressing room feeling confused or lost. We knew exactly what to do. We were so well prepared that very little was said during a game. During time out it was just a matter of correcting individual play. There was no mass hysteria. Again it was the efficiency of the thing that impressed me. Basically you were on your own before and after practice or a game. If you had problems, you went to Harry (Lancaster)."

Rice received a letter from Furman Bishop after Georgia Tech lost to the Wildcats in Atlanta that year. Bishop says:

"You will seldom, if ever, see a boy so big with so much grace, so much agility, so much maneuverability and with so soft and velvety a touch as Nash. There were times when Rupp was using this versatile young man to bring the ball down court when Georgia Tech pressed its defense. With his size and his massive hands, Nash gave the impression of a circus giant dribbling an orange."

Cotton was the first sophomore in 10 years to capture the league scoring crown, won unanimous All-SEC honors, was accorded SEC "Player of the Year", became only the sixth sophomore in history to be chosen on the USBWA first string All-America. He was described by his proud coach as the nation's second best cager—second only to Jerry Lucas.

In Cotton's senior year, Rupp sprang a big surprise on Tennessee and Coach Ray Mears. The surprise, Rupp said, was "a transitional and shifting man-to-man backed by a hyperbolic paraboloid between the ball and the basket." Today we call that "hyperbolic paraboloid" the 1-3-1 zone defense.

After graduation in 1964, Cotton played professional ball for ten years. He played baseball in the American League with organizations in California, Minnesota and Chicago, Illinois, and basketball in both the NBA and ABA.

He is presently in the real estate business in Lexington.

The Last Time

Kentucky Defeated Louisiana State University 85-70 in Baton Rouge

Jack "Goose" Givens made 13 of 18 shots, totalled 33 points and claimed 11 rebounds and in the process Kentucky defeated LSU 85-70 March 1, 1976 in Baton Rouge.

The "Goose" scored 20 points in the first half, as Kentucky never trailed, led by 16 points twice and held a 46-38 edge at half-time.

In the second half, Louisiana State began shooting well, controlling the boards and forcing a few UK turnovers. The Tigers closed to within 66-62 with nine and a half minutes showing.

With only two minutes left the Cats were ahead 81-66. Contributing to Kentucky's success were five Tiger turnovers, seven misses from the floor and two failures at the foul line. LSU missed 13 of its last 15 shots from the field, went scoreless for more than five minutes in dropping its 12th game of the year.

According to Coach Hall, "The players showed great poise when we needed it. It's quite a tribute to our great determination and organization. I was real pleased with the way we handled the press tonight."

In outscoring LSU 19-8 over the last nine and a half minutes, the Wildcats only turned the ball over four times, once in the final seconds.

Kenny Higgs' 20 points led LSU, Brown had 14 and a game-high of 18 rebounds. Ed LeBlanc and Randy Coppens contributed 12 points each.

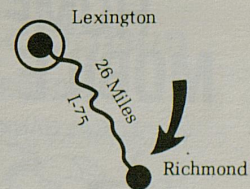

When I think of LSU, three players immediately jump into my mind—a great rebounder named Al "Little Apple" Sanders, Bob Pettit, probably the best player LSU ever had and of course, "Pistol Pete" Maravich—the most colorful basketball player the Tigers ever had. Pete did a lot for basketball throughout the whole Southeastern Conference.

Maravich was a great showman. He would say, "It's show time," and he'd go out and really put on a show. I think that he still has some unbroken records around the conference. In the three years he played for LSU, he had a total of 3,667 points. He scored at least 50 in one game 28 times in his career (a major college record including a record 10 times in 1970. He is the leader in the All-Time Major College Scoring category for a career with an average of 44.2 and for a season (1970) with 44.5.

During the time Pete played for LSU the Tigers had record crowds but they all came out to see one man. (The largest crowd ever to watch a college basketball game in the state of Louisiana was set by LSU when 14,413 were in attendance at the LSU-Kentucky game during the 1972-73 season).

Pete had some great nights, but he never played on an LSU team that defeated Kentucky.

I'm really anxious to see a young fella who's leading the conference in rebounding this year. Freshman Durand Macklin graduated 18th in his class from Shawnee High School in Louisville last year. Kentucky tried very hard to get him, but he and his coach, Ron Abernathy, chose LSU. He was one of the state's many outstanding players last season and is apparently playing great ball for the Tigers.

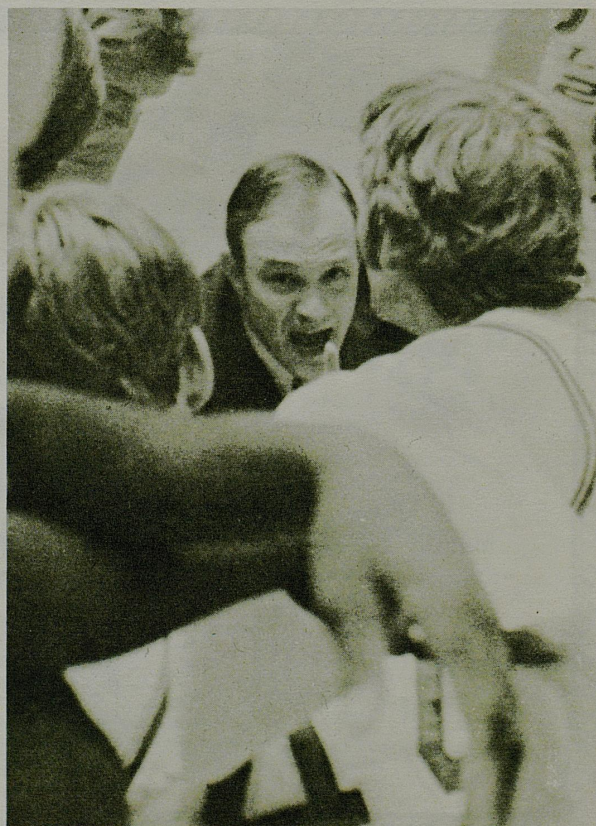
Dale Brown

Head Basketball Coach

Louisiana State University

DALE BROWN is in his fifth year as head coach at LSU and his 20th year as a basketball coach. He coached 15 years in high school, military, and college ranks. His head coaching record for basketball at all levels was 132-73 for a .644 winning percentage. That record included six championships. Besides basketball, Brown also coached track, and wrestling and assisted in football. His first collegiate job was as an assistant at Utah State (1966-1971) for five years. He then moved to Washington State as an assistant for a year (1971-72) prior to taking over at LSU.

In 1975-76, LSU was 12-14 overall and 5-13 for ninth place in the SEC.

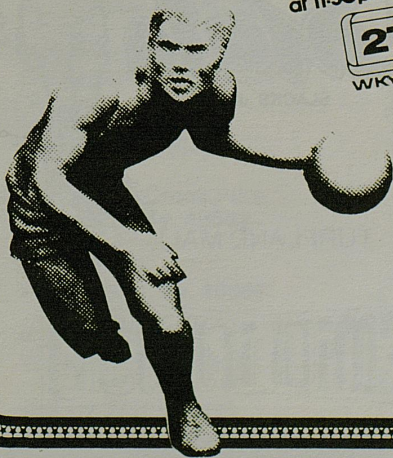


1977 BENGAL BASKETBALL ROSTER

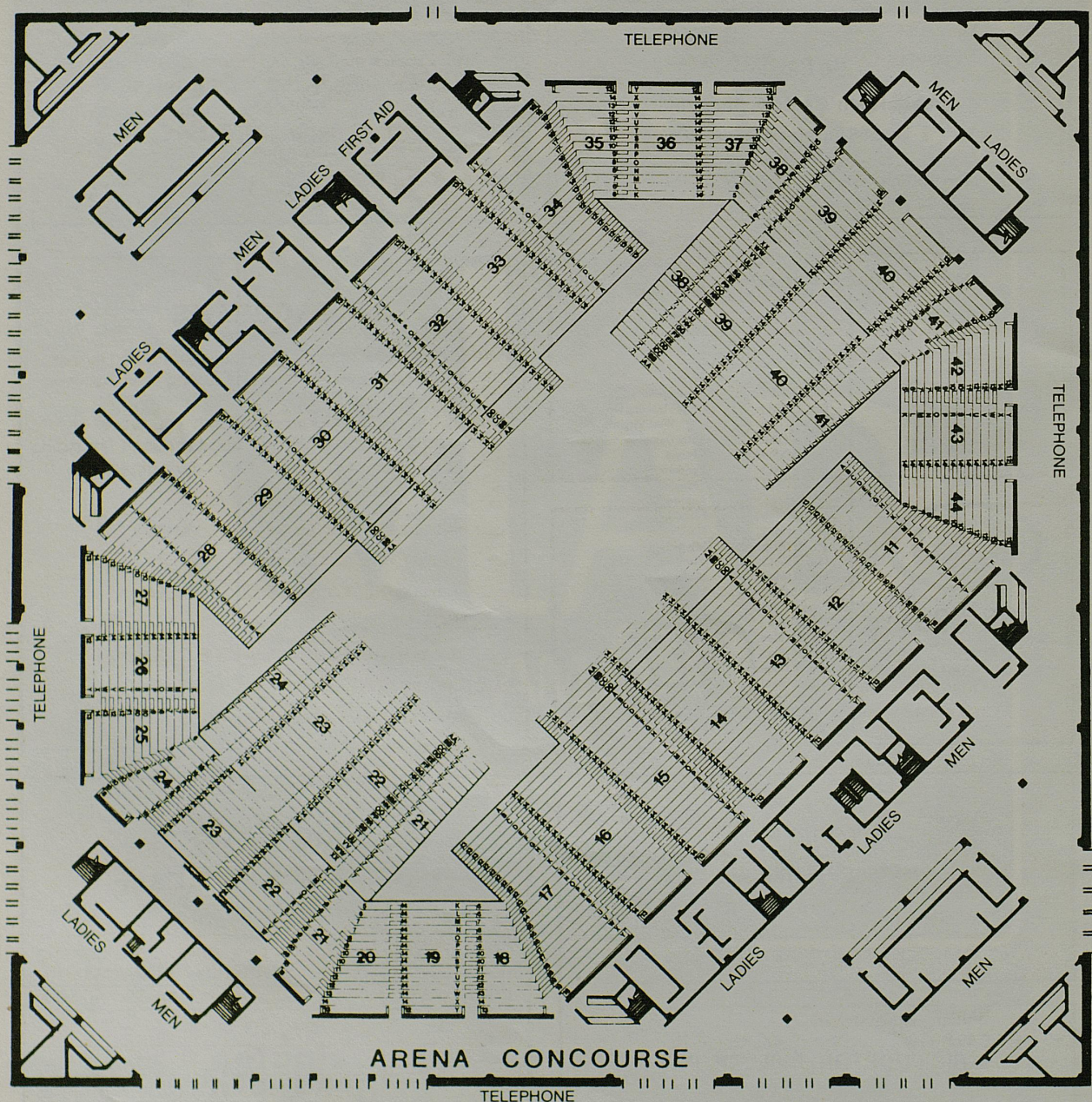

FIRST AID

Doctors on call and other individuals who might expect an emergency call are requested to leave their name and seat location at the will call window of the box office prior to entering Rupp Arena. In the event of an emergency, you will be notified at your seat. In order that the activities and program in Rupp Arena not be disrupted, paging over the public address system is not possible.

CARDIAC CARE

In cooperation with the University Medical Service, the University of Kentucky provides a cardiac resuscitation program at all UK basketball games.

LOST AND FOUND

Lost and found articles should be reported or turned in to an usher or a security officer. You may wish to write to the director of arena security and describe lost articles which will be returned if found.

Rupp Arena will normally open one hour prior to any scheduled event. Please do not leave the arena until the conclusion of an event or game or at half-time if you plan to re-enter. No "Pass-out" tickets will be issued and you will not be permitted to re-enter.

COURT REGULATIONS

Spectators must keep off the court at all times. Spectators must use the arena stairs and vomitories. There are no public facilities located on the arena floor level. Public facilities in Rupp Arena are located on the entry concourse level. You will find all refreshment stands, drinking fountains, public telephones, restrooms, vending machines and first aid on the concourse level.

LIQUORS

Alcoholic beverages are strictly prohibited within the arena as are all food and drink containers including hard surfaced materials of any type, bottles, cans, thermos bottles, ice bags, ice chest, and any object related to above.
