The Faculty convened to hear the report of the Committee appointed to determine the graduating honors.

First Report
Com. to De-
termine College
Honors.

Mr. Roark, the chairman, reported that the first honor had been awarded to Mr. Brand, of the Classical Course, and the second honor to Mr. Faig, of the Mechanical Engineering Course; and, further, that the grades made in the Military Department had not been taken into consideration in making these awards, as they had not been heretofore. (The action of the Committee upon the matter of grades in the Military Department is hereby suspended, verba- tum: Inasmuch as the standing of students in Military Science has not till recently been regarded by the Faculty of this College as an element in determining "honors" at the time of graduation, and as some of the graduating class took their course of instruction in Military Science before it was regarded as an element bearing upon the determination of honors, we, the Committee charged with determining the honors for the class of 1894, decide that we will not count the standing of the members of the present class in Military Science, but we do recommend that the Faculty direct our President to state publicly in Chapel that in the future the grades in Military Science of all male candidates for graduation will be counted.)

Matter of

After a full discussion the whole matter was referred back to the Committee, with instruction to consider the military standing of the candidates, and give it its due weight.
