ARTICLES OF AGREEMENT, made and concluded this 22nd day of April, A. D. One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, by and between the several persons whose names are hereunto signed in attestation of the due execution hereof.

WHEREAS, It is the desire of the parties hereto to supply a limited credit with the banks and trust companies of the City of Ashland, Kentucky, by commercial paper or paper secured by collateral and in securing the discount or sale of the same for the maker or makers thereof who may be in need of financial assistance in either the construction of or operation of industrial plants either located or which may hereafter be located in the City of Ashland, State of Kentucky, or in the territory in the State of Kentucky adjacent thereto.

NOW THIS AGREEMENT WITNESSETH, That the said parties hereto as well for and in consideration of the premises, as also for and in consideration of the covenants, stipulations and agreements hereinafter contained on the part of each and every of the said parties hereto, to be kept and performed, as also for and in consideration of the sum of One Dollar from each to the other paid, the receipts whereof are hereby acknowledged, have agreed and do hereby agree to and with each other, each for himself, herself and/or itself respectively to and with each and every, the other, for themselves, their and each of their respective heirs, executors, administrators, and successors in manner following, to wit:

FIRST.--That the said parties do hereby nominate, constitute and appoint John E. Buckingham, John Woods, J. H. Kitchen, S. S. Willis and H. R. Dysard of Ashland, Kentucky, or any three of them, to be their lawful attorneys-in-fact for them and in their names to indorse commercial paper and renewals thereof, and paper secured by collateral, as accommodation indorsers for the maker or makers thereof, under and subject nevertheless, to the conditions, qualifications, limitations and restrictions hereinafter specified.

SECOND.--The sums of money realized from such commercial paper or paper secured by collateral either by the discount thereof or the sale thereof shall be used by the said Attorneys-in-fact for either the construction of or the operation of industrial plants which are now located or which may hereafter be located in the City of Ashland, State of Kentucky, or in the territory in said State adjacent thereto and for no other purpose.

THIRD.--That when and as often as the said attorneys-in-fact or their successors to be appointed as hereinafter specified, or any three of them, shall indorse commercial paper or paper secured by collateral under the power herein contained, they shall alone exercise such power by the following conditional qualified and restrictive indorsement, to wit: By their own proper and respective signatures of the attorneys-in-fact, or any three of them, hereunder and followed with the following words and figures, viz:

Attorneys-in-fact constituted under agreement dated April twenty-second one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, with restricted and conditional powers of indorsement to be exercised only according to the terms of said agreement.

And immediately upon each and every indorsement made by virtue of this agreement, the person, firm or corporation indorses of said attorneys-in-fact, or any three of them, and discounting or purchasing such commercial paper or paper secured by collateral shall certify upon the proper page attached hereto a memorandum of the note or paper so indorsed or discounted or purchased,

giving the date thereof, when and where payable, the amount, the maker or makers thereof, the names of all prior indorsers if any, the name of the indorsee of the said attorneys-in-fact so discounting or purchasing the paper, the rate of discount or interest and when and where the same was discounted or purchased, and a full description of collateral if any accompany the same, and when any such note so indorsed and discounted or purchased has been paid, the said attorneys-in-fact shall procure a certificate from the same source to be entered upon the proper page attached hereto, showing when and by whom the same was paid. All such certificates to remain at all times attached to this agreement and to form a part hereof.

FOURTH.--That the total liability of the several respective parties hereto on all commercial paper, and/or paper secured by collateral to be indorsed hereunder, shall be limited to the amount they set opposite their respective names in executing this agreement, and on any one individual piece of such commercial paper, or paper secured by collateral, so as aforesaid to be indorsed, each of the said parties hereto shall be liable only in the same proportion as the amount he, she or it sets opposite his, her or its signature in executing this agreement bears to the total of the amounts all the parties hereto set opposite their names in executing this agreement. It being understood and agreed that there is no joint liability hereunder, and that no one of the parties hereto shall in any manner be liable for the default of any of the others, parties hereto.

FIFTH.--That at no one time shall the total amount of the outstanding commercial paper, and paper secured by collateral, to be indorsed by virtue of and in conformity with the provisions of this agreement, exceed the total sum of the amounts set opposite the names of the several parties executing this agreement.

SIXTH.--In the case of the death of any one or more of the parties executing this agreement, or in case any one or more of them shall become insolvent or in such condition that his, her or its credit is declined by those who discount or purchase such commercial paper, or paper secured by collateral, then and in either of those events this agreement shall not cease or determine or be affected as to the others, but the remaining parties hereto shall, for any future indorsements by said attorneys-in-fact, or any three of them, be severally liable in the proportion which the amount set opposite their several and respective names bears to the total amounts set opposite the names of all those then living, not insolvent, or whose credit is not declined, as aforesaid: Provided always, that other subscriptions hereto may be received to fill the place of those who are deceased, insolvent or without credit as aforesaid: And Provided further, that there is no joint liability hereunder, and that the total liability of each person subscribing hereto can in no event exceed the amount set opposite his, her or its name, signed hereto.

SEVENTH.--That no indorsement whatever shall be made by the attorneys-in-fact, or any three of the, under and in pursuance of the terms of this agreement, of any commercial paper or paper secured by collateral or any renewal thereof, unless such commercial paper or paper secured by collateral or renewals shall be first approved by the Industrial Guaranty Trustees of the Ashland Chamber of Commerce of the City of Ashland, Kentucky, and which said approval shall alone be evidenced by a certificate in writing to that effect executed by the President, or any of the Vice-Presidents, of said Chamber of Commerce.

EIGHTH.--Notice of protest of any commercial paper, or paper secured by collateral or renewal or renewals thereof, indorsed by said attorneys-in-fact, shall be binding upon the several parties executing this agreement, when given to or served upon said attorneys-in-fact, or any one of them, in the manner usual in such

cases, and they, or any one of the, are hereby given authority to waive protest and notice of non-payment of any such commercial paper or paper secured by collateral or renewals thereof, and of the homestead exception.

NINTH.--This agreement shall remain in force for the period of five years from and after the date hereof, but no liability for indorsements made during said term of five years shall be released by the expiration of said term unless the said endorsees, discounters and purchasers of said paper made or renewed during said term and unpaid at the expiration of said term shall consent in writing to the release of such liability.

TENTH.--In case of the death, incapacity, removal from his appointment as attorney-in-fact, refusal to act or resignation of any of the said attorneys-in-fact hereunder, the parties hereto (or three-fourths thereof, in the amount of their subscription hereto), shall within thirty days after a vacancy is so caused, agree upon some competent persons as his successor, and a memorandum naming such successor, signed by the parties so agreeing shall be attached hereto and thereafter form a part of this agreement. And in the event of a failure to agree upon a successor, as aforesaid, the Circuit Court of Boyd County, or the judge thereof in vacation, upon the petition of any of the parties hereto, shall fill such vacancy by appointment thereto of a successor, and a certificate of such appointment shall be then attached hereto; PROVIDED HOWEVER, that until such vacancy shall be filled the remaining attorneys-in-fact, or any three of them, shall have full power to act as though no vacancy existed.

ELEVENTH.--Should the parties hereto be compelled to take up and pay as herein provided any commercial paper, or paper secured by collateral, indorsed by their attorneys-in-fact, or any three of them, in accordance with the powers conferred upon them by the terms hereof, and the holder or holders of such paper shall have been paid in full, the said attorneys-in-fact shall take the same and use all endeavors to collect the amount due thereon from the maker or makers, prior indorser, or indorsers thereof, and if successful in collecting the whole or any part thereof, they shall distribute the net proceeds, when realized, to and among the parties hereto in the same proportions as they had theretofore bore on account thereof in taking up such commercial paper or paper secured by collateral; but if the holder or holders of such paper shall not have been paid in full by the parties hereto, the holder or holders shall retain all rights against the maker or makers, prior indorser or indorsers, and all rights to convert and apply all collateral to the portion of the indebtedness not paid by the parties hereto as indorsers, provided that any surplus from the collateral thereafter remaining shall be paid over to the attorneys-in-fact to be divided among the parties hereto, who have paid their respective shares of such indorsements as herein above set out, until they are repaid in full, or until the fund so realized shall become exhausted.

TWELFTH.--The said attorneys-in-fact, or their successors, or any three of them are hereby appointed the custodians of this agreement, and the several parties executing this agreement authorize and empower them to give copies thereof, certified by the, or any three of the, to any person, firm or corporation discounting or purchasing such commercial paper, or paper secured by collateral; which copies, so certified, shall be received in evidence in any Court of law or equity with the same force and effect as if this original agreement were there offered.

THIRTEENTH.--The several parties executing this agreement further severally agree that if, as and when they may be called upon by the holder or holders of such commercial paper and/or

paper secured by collateral and endorsed as hereinabove authorized, from time to time, to pay any such paper as to which the maker thereof is in default, the holder or holders of such paper from time to time may sue at law, or in equity or proceed by motion to recover from the parties severally and in separate proceedings the amount for which such party is liable, without proceeding against all of such parties in one proceeding.

FOURTEENTH.--This agreement for convenience is dated the 22nd day of April, 1926, although not executed by all parties on that date. Counterparts of this agreement may be executed by the several parties with the same effect as if all the parties had executed one and the same instrument.

FIFTEENTH.--This agreement shall bind the heirs, executors, administrators, and successors of the parties respectively.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto have hereunto signed their names, set their seal, and, in conformity with the hereinbefore recited terms of this agreement, have placed and amount or sum of money opposite their respective names; Done the day and year first above written.

Dear Mr. Herne:

I have just read your article on the Hanging
Rock Iron region as published in the Iron
Trade Review and enjoyed them very much.

I often regret that I did not record the
many incidents my father and others related
about the charcoal iron business. When I entered
business life the problem was to get the family
out of charcoal iron production and into the
production of coke iron and steel. In 1890 at the
time of the death of Thomas W. Means, Means Kyle
& Company owned 22000 acres of land in Ohio and
The Means & Russell Iron Company owned 30,000
acres in Kentucky. When the panic of 1891-93
occured, it looked as if the family were land
poor and in 1895 I persuaded the officers of those
companies to scrap the charcoal furnaces so there
would be no further temptation to operate.

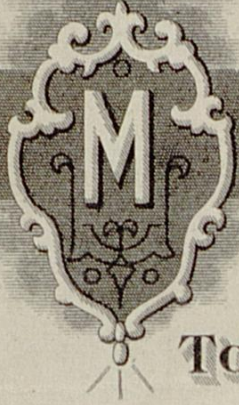

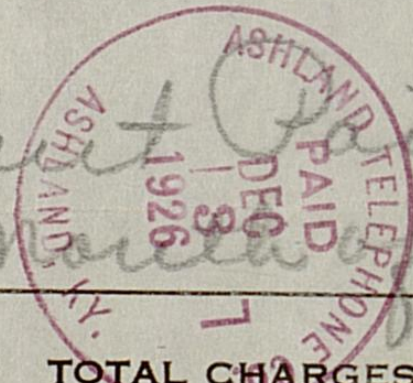
