I get real lonesome some
-times, but it is a nice
place to rest, and spend
vacation. I don't like to
live in the country at all.
I spent last week in Hous-
-ton, I had a nice time.
I am not acquainted
with your friend
Mr Eagle, I know of him,
he is a nice man. Are
you related to Judge
Pailey of Houston? Conroe
is a small town of 2000.
I am 120 miles from
Henderson and 40 from

Houston. This is not a
pretty country, and is
the poorest part of Tex.

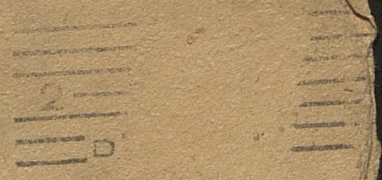

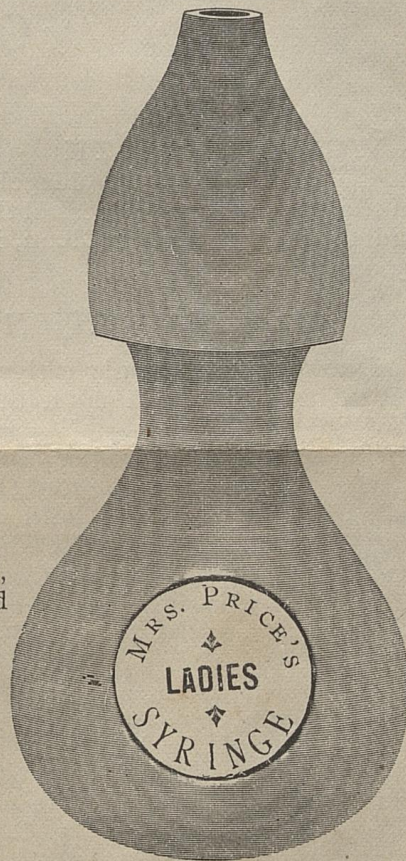

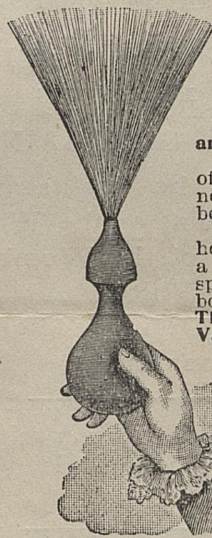

beat the fast mail and make a greater speed than
40 miles per hour.
