THE ACADEMIC LIBRARY CONSULTANT TRAINING PROGRAM 1980/81

The purpose of this program is to provide the opportunity for outstanding librarians to develop skills in identifying and diagnosing library problems, study theory and concepts of library training and consultation, gain experience in the consultation process, gain an operational understanding of Office of Management Studies (OMS) self-study procedures and their applications, and to increase skills in facilitating groups engaged in problem solving.

All training is conducted on a complimentary basis, and consultants will be reimbursed for travel and maintenance costs during the 6-12 month training period. Deadline for application is July 31, 1980.

FROM SOLINET NEWS RELEASE

The annual SOLINET meeting was held in Atlanta May 8-9. Its official theme was "The Role Of A Regional Network."

To implement SOLINET's intention to develop a regional support system, four steps have been taken:

1. The network has negotiated a contract with OCLC, Inc. that allows for network development and provides for a communications processor to be installed at network headquarters by September 1, 1980.

2. SOLINET has negotiated a contract with the Washington State Library Commission to use the Washington Library Network (WLN) system as the basis for the new regional system. The WLN software will be adapted to handle a larger workload and meet the specific requirements of the SOLINET membership.

3. SOLINET has acquired larger quarters that will house the growing data center and staff needed to develop and operate the Regional Support System.

4. The network has arranged a contract with Burroughs Corporation that will provide hardware and software conversion for the project, yet limit SOLINET's risk and financial liability.

It was at this meeting that Paul Willis was elected to the SOLINET Board of Directors.

Formed to serve libraries in the ten southeastern states, SOLINET is a non-profit cooperative that provides library automation services and products to over 225 members.
