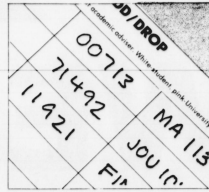

University active during summer session

Administration changes, selective admissions among summer actions

While this summer may have been a period of rest and relaxation for some students and faculty, it was a time of activity for the University. Several major decisions were made during the summer session concerning the future and operation of the University. Here is a brief summary of some of the more important actions:

UK reorganizes administration

A University reorganization plan calling for the addition of three chancellorships was approved by the UK Board of Trustees on June 22. The plan, introduced by President Otis Singletary, called for new chancellorships for the main campus, community colleges and the UK Medical Center. Art Gallaher was named main campus chancellor, Dr. Peter Bortworth was appointed chancellor for the medical center and Charles Wethington was named chancellor of the community college system. The positions are revised forms of former vice presidencies in the three areas.

Under the new system, the chancellors report directly to the president. All other officers, colleges, schools and departments will report to the chancellors.

In an interview published in the 1982 *Summer Kentucky Kernel*, Singletary said the system is based upon the administrative structure of the University of Tennessee and the previous model used by the University of North Carolina.

"Basically, you have a president who handles most of the statewide stuff and the chancellors who handle the internal procedures and operations of the institution," he said.

"Clearly, the chancellors will be closer to the day-to-day operations than one president could ever be," Singletary said.

He said one new position of vice chancellor for academic affairs probably will not be filled for another year.

Trustees move for admissions policy

The UK Board of Trustees voted June 22 to establish the first admission standards policy in the school's history.

The policy will replace one that now guarantees admission for all students who graduate from a Kentucky high school and who take the

American College Test (ACT), Singletary said. Specific admission criteria will be determined later by the University's faculty senate, he said. Such criteria typically include college entrance exam scores, high school grades and class standing.

The policy must now be approved by the Kentucky Council on Higher Education.

UK began preparing the admissions policy when the council adopted a recommendation calling for a "mission model" concept of higher education in Kentucky and in response to the CHE's Prichard Committee report, *In Pursuit of Excellence*.

Dental school could be closed

Closing UK's dental school is one of two options that have been developed by the state to deal with a glut of dentists statewide.

The other option, according to a position paper prepared by the Council on Higher Education, is to continue reducing first-year enrollments at UK and the state's other dental school at the University of Louisville.

The position paper was mailed to council members last month. It asks them to familiarize themselves with the topic, which may be on the agenda for the council's October meeting.

The paper contends Kentucky's dental needs can be met by reducing entering classes from a 1980 level of 148 students to 110-115 students a year.

The council, the state's coordinating agency for higher education, has been struggling with what to do about the potential oversupply of dentists for the past few years.

The Prichard Committee, a citizens' group that studied the future of higher education in the state last year, discussed the question, but made no final recommendation, primarily because the council had not finished studying the issue.

That study — now in draft form — is the basis for the recommendation to reduce dental-school enrollment.

UK dental dean Merrill Packer, and UL dental dean Dr. Frederick Parkins both said they could not comment on any specifics in the paper because they had not yet seen it.

Packer said he would "hate to see some decision made" without an in-depth look at overall dental educational services. Parkins said the issue needs to be

resolved soon.

"If it's decided to keep both schools, we look forward to a collaborative relationship" with UK, Parkins said. But if the ultimate decision is to keep only the UL school, he said, it should be made soon because his school already has started a three-year faculty reduction plan.

Both schools have agreed to a 25 percent enrollment reduction, which is already under way, he said.

Factors favoring closing the UK school include saving money on administrative costs, the paper stated. Also, UL has enough space to handle any increased enrollment, and by combining schools in one site, educational quality probably would be enhanced because the best talent would be in one site, the paper said.

Factors supporting reduced enrollment at both schools include the dental service programs operated by the schools, which serve their respective parts of the state, and potential litigation from closure, the paper stated. Also, "friendly competition" is sparked by the existence of two schools, it stated.

Last year, the UK and UL dental schools had a total of 570 students. Entering students totaled 134 — 57 at UK and 77 at UL — which is down from a high of nearly 150 students in 1975.

The surplus of dentists throughout the country has come about because the government — concerned about a potential shortage after the post-war baby boom — helped finance new dental schools and paid them stipends for each student attending. The number of dental graduates

has soared while population growth has tapered off in recent years. In Kentucky, the dentist-population ratio has dropped between 1975 and 1980, from one dentist for every 2,490 residents to one for each 2,342.

Griffin named UK trustee

George W. Griffin, a London businessman, was named Aug. 3 to the UK Board of Trustees by Gov. John Y. Brown.

Griffin, 55, had served on the board for 12 years until his last term expired about two years ago. He replaces Thomas Kessinger of Lexington.

Griffin is president of the Laurel Grocery Co. of East Bernstadt and is a major stockholder in Appalachia Computer Services, Inc. of London.

He also is director of the Cumberland Valley National Bank of London and the First National Bank of Manchester.

Fitzgerald goes to Houston

Peter Fitzgerald, UK's special assistant for business and financial affairs, has been appointed vice chancellor of administration for the University of Houston's central campus effective Sept. 1.

His appointment must still be approved by Houston's Board of Regents.

Fitzgerald had just received a new title on July 1, when he became a member of Singletary's cabinet under the new University administration reorganization.

Name change, Banahan nomination recall highlight summer SGA actions

Pep rally scheduled

UK no longer has a Student Association because of action taken by the UK Board of Trustees over the summer session.

Instead, UK has a Student Government Association.

The name change, a campaign goal of SGA President Jim Dinkle, was made official at the Trustees June 22 meeting. Because of the recognition given to SGA by the Board, the name change required amendments to the University's governing regulations concerning the organization.

Dinkle, telecommunications senior, in his recommendation to the Board, said he recommended the change "to give students a clearer idea" of SGA's purposes.

Banahan nomination voided

The nomination of Senator-at-Large Katy Banahan as chairman of the Senate's Political Affairs Committee was voided by the SGA Summer Judicial Board, acting on a complaint by Senator-at-Large Jack Dulworth.

Dulworth maintained that John Davenport, chairman pro tempore of the committee, did not have the legal authority to confirm Banahan, political science junior, as chairman.

In evidence presented to the judicial board, Dulworth contended that of the six members in attendance at the April 29 election meeting, only four votes could be proven for Banahan. Also, a record of the voting was not entered into the minutes of the committee's meeting.

Billy Bob Renner, chief justice of the judicial board, wrote in the unanimous decision that "a chairman cannot be nominated by a simple majority of those committee members present at the meetings unless he/she received votes totaling more than one half of the committee's membership."

Renner, third year law student, ordered Davenport, political science junior, to "arrange a future meeting for the nomination of a chairperson consistent with the SGA Constitution, bylaws and this decision."

The summer Interim Senate, at their June 24 meeting, approved a proposal by Dinkle and SGA Vice President David Bradford, accounting senior, for a pep rally welcoming Coach Jerry Claiborne to UK on 8:00 p.m. Thursday, Sept. 16 at Memorial Coliseum.

SGA is presently searching for a "celebrity host(ess)" to serve as master of ceremonies. Admission to the rally will be free.

SGA supports Amnesty Int. Chapter

The Interim Senate approved a bill sponsored by Dinkle and Vincent Yeh, graduate school senator and physics graduate student, supporting the formation of an Amnesty International campus network on the UK campus.

The UK chapter has adopted Maciejlaw Bednarski, a worker imprisoned in Poland for his actions with Solidarity, the country's subordinated labor union, as their central cause, publicly urging Polish authorities for his release.

Dinkle has formally invited Polish government officials and the SGA Washington lobbying team talked to the country's embassy officials on Bednarski's behalf.

SGA lobbies in Washington, D.C.

A five member SGA delegation traveled to Washington Aug. 15-20 to lobby "issues of importance to UK students."

The group, consisting of Dinkle, Dulworth, Banahan, Campus Liaison Lawrence Bising, business and economics sophomore, and Cabinet Secretary Leslie Bingham, music senior, met with members of Kentucky's congressional delegation and members of the Reagan administration.

Add/drop: Know what to do before you go

If you are unhappy with the schedule that the computer gave you, an option remains to beat the machine. Add/drop, the procedure by which you can change your schedule to fit your academic needs, is probably your best bet.

The procedure will be centralized for one day — tomorrow in Memorial Coliseum starting at 10 a.m.

Although the one-day centralized add/drop saves students from walking to the different academic departments to change their schedule, the huge crowds and long lines may be the source of a very frustrating day.

Before traveling to the Coliseum, plan ahead what you want to add

and what you want to drop. Once you have decided, you need to get a computer card for each class change. The computer cards can be picked up from the individual department tables located on the concourse and central floor of the Coliseum.

For example: If you were adding JOU 101 and dropping MA 113, you would need a computer card from the mathematics department and the journalism department.

You will also need an add/drop slip to complete all you schedule transactions. Only one add/drop slip will be needed because each slip has space for seven class changes. All computer cards must be filled out with a No. 2 lead pencil.

Here are some other things students should remember before going to centralized add/drop:

- Get an instruction sheet provided at the entrance. It will provide a detailed explanation for the entire add/drop procedure. It also includes a map of the Coliseum showing the location of the different tables.
- Get an IBM permit card. One such card is assigned to every student. You can get your card at the entrance; every student going through centralized add/drop must have this card.
- Always add a class before you drop a class. Make sure you can get the class you want before you drop any course.
- Have your UK student ID with you at all times.
- You may pick up the add/drop slip from your adviser before coming to the Coliseum, or you can pick up one from the check-in table in the Coliseum.

— Arrive at your appointed time (see schedule box). Students are processed alphabetically. Although you can arrive late and still go through centralized add/drop, no student will be admitted before his or her appointed time.

You also can change your grade option (audit, pass-fail and letter) and adjust the number of credit hours for variable courses tomorrow at the Coliseum.

Tomorrow is also the last day you can withdraw from a class and be eligible for a full refund. Classes will start on Wednesday.

Also on Wednesday, non-centralized add/drop for Arts & Sciences will be held in the Buell Armory; all other add/drop procedures will be held in the dean's office of the individual colleges.

Capacity crowd

Well... not really, however about 6,000 student went through centralized add/drop last semester and an equal number is expected tomorrow. Officials urge students to bring their own schedule books because they are in scarce supply.

Student expenses increase by \$300 per year

Financial assistance available despite tight budgets

Although no new money is available, financial aid assistance to UK students should not be less than last year, said James Ingie, director of financial aid.

Financial aid awards have fallen about \$400 short of need, Ingie said. But, "There is enough to cover tuition, room and board."

But some students may go without any financial aid because of in-

creased costs and limited funds.

Ingie estimated a \$300 increase in expenses for students from last year. This includes increased tuition and housing along with the inflation rate. (It is higher for out-of-state students.)

And because of limited funds, those whose estimated need was less than \$2,000 did not receive aid. Ingie indicated they would receive priority if any funds become available through students not claiming financial aid awards. He said about 15 percent of the money offered will not be claimed.

And students will still be eligible

for a guaranteed student loan.

"All financial aid money has been committed," he said. This includes supplemental grants, scholarships and National Direct Student Loans. Pell Grants, which are determined on the basis of need by the federal government, and guaranteed student loans are not committed, yet. Also some nursing loan money is available.

So if a student is eligible, financial aid can still be acquired. Ingie said if a student already had the necessary forms filled out they would stand a better chance of getting aid because of the time involved in pro-

cessing applications and completing need assessments.

Although overall funds are at about the same level as last year, Ingie explained that he expects to get slightly more work study money than originally indicated by the U.S. Department of Education. In addition, the maximum that can be claimed for room and board is slightly higher and the maximum Pell Grant that can be awarded increased some.

In the future, he said he expects "no further cutbacks" in aid along with "no increases and no new money."

Aid payments will be broken into two sums

Students will not receive all financial aid awarded to them when they go to claim it in the fee payment line at the Student Center Ballroom, said James Ingie, financial aid director.

Tuition, housing and other expenses will be deducted from the financial aid and a credit receipt given to the student. Personnel in the ballroom will tell them where they can pick up the check for the balance, he said. The check is available two days after claiming financial aid.

These sources of financial aid that will be received when taking care of fee payments are scholarships, state grants and guaranteed student loans, Ingie said. This is because those organizations make the checks payable directly to students. Whereas, federal money is dispersed by the University.

"This will keep us from voiding so many checks" because students end up not attending UK, he said "writing checks is expensive." Remaining Pell, S.E.O.G. or National Direct Student Loan monies will be included in the check.

Another change taking effect this semester, he said is payment of housing. Centralized collection for room and board will be in the ballroom also.

Once in the ballroom, there will be no separate lines for housing pay-

ments or financial aid students, he said. The lines will still be broken down alphabetically but there will be only one line to take care of payments. This does not include Student Health Fee payments.

Additionally, the \$50 assessment fee, which was due Aug. 4, will be figured in on the credit receipt, he said. For instance, if you only owe tuition, \$426, and you paid the \$50 fee, the balance owed would be \$376. If your financial aid allotment is \$1,000, the \$376 would be deducted and you would receive a check for \$624.

If financial aid is not claimed by the 10th day of classes, it will be cancelled, he said.

And Hall doesn't particularly want to think about Bowie not being able to play again, either. When Bowie was questioned about the prospect of the leg not healing or he not playing again, Hall's livid reaction was,

"Don't you think that's a little morbid at this point?"

But whether they want to admit it or not, a stress fracture is not like a regular fracture, especially in a leg that is 41 inches long, and the prospect that it will heal completely, or even at all, will have to be taken into consideration. It's been 54 weeks.

After all, Bill Walton had a stress fracture.

First-year football coach Jerry Claiborne's "lay-down-the-law" approach to football may be the thing the team needs this year.

Just before the freshmen came to camp, Claiborne issued a warning to all players that anyone reporting to fall practice out of shape would not be issued a uniform.

That just might save the Athletics Association money.

UK fared pretty well in various summer for professional sports. Chuck Verderber was drafted in the seventh round by the Chicago Bulls, but the odds of him making the big leagues must have looked too low as Verderber opted to go to Spain to play pro basketball and return to dental school whenever.

Tickets for the Jazz Series go on sale Sept. 10. The schedule for the Jazz Series will be announced shortly. Tickets may be purchased at the Student Center Ticket Offices.

Sept. 10-11 Stanley Kubrick's futuristic movie *A Clockwork Orange* will be shown. Three films are scheduled for Sept. 16-22, *Stripes*, *All That Jazz* and *The Kids are Alright*.

The grand opening celebration for the opening of the Student Center Addition is scheduled Sept. 17-19. Sept. 17, dedication of the Worsham Theater begins at 6:30 p.m. A free movie is scheduled to celebrate the theater's opening. Drawings for free prizes will be held following the movie. Sept. 19 free cartoons will be shown for children of students, faculty and staff at 10 a.m.

That same day, a ribbon cutting ceremony for the new building will be at 3 p.m. There will also be band concerts and a reception following the ceremony.

The Wildcats go against Clemson at Clemson at 1 p.m. on Oct. 2. Oct. 9 Auburn greets the Cats for an afternoon game (1:30) at Auburn. The following week LSU makes a trip to UK for a 7:30 evening game at the University. Oct. 30 sees the Cats traveling to Blacksburg to play Virginia Tech at 1:30 p.m.

November - The spectacle called Homecoming is scheduled Nov. 6 at 1:30 p.m. The Wildcats face the Commodores of Vanderbilt at Commonwealth Stadium. The following week, Florida comes to UK for another afternoon game (1:30). The final game of the season is scheduled Nov. 20. The Cats battle the Tennessee Volunteers at Commonwealth Stadium. The game begins at 1:30 p.m.

Nov. 1-2 the Student Center Activities Board will present *Dr. Strangelove*.

December - The Theater Department will present *Eyore's Christmas Present* Dec. 4 and 5.

New student publications adviser sought

Green leaves UK for similar advising position in Texas

Nancy L. Green, UK student publications adviser and a key figure in the fight to make the *Kentucky Kernel* an independent student newspaper, has accepted a similar position at the University of Texas at Austin.

Green, UK adviser since August 1971, became general manager for *Texas Student Publications* on Aug. 15.

She will manage *The Daily Texan*, UT's 39,000 daily circulation student newspaper, the *Cactus* yearbook, the *UTmost* student magazine and the university's student directory.

Green was the *Kernel*'s adviser when the newspaper moved toward independence from the University in 1971. She was instrumental in the development of the *Kernel Press, Inc.*, which operates the business affairs of the newspaper.

As UK's student publication adviser, Green also worked with the *Kentucky Yearbook* and the *Kentucky Greek and Communicator* newspapers.

Green received her bachelor's degree in journalism from UK in 1964, serving as summer editor, assistant managing editor and women's editor for the *Kernel*.

As of Aug. 10, UK has not hired a new student publications adviser to replace Green.

Applying right could help you receive aid

Cutbacks in federal aid to college students mean more of a scramble than ever for the dollars that are left and you have a better chance of getting your fair share of help if you know how to apply.

There are five basic aid programs for the 1982-83 academic year, including grants which do not have to be repaid and loans which do. (Note: The government usually defines the academic year as running from July 1 to June 30 - not from the beginning of the fall semester to the end of the spring semester.)

You should apply for help as early as possible, but it is still not too late to seek aid for the coming semester. Some awards are even retroactive.

There are general eligibility guidelines for all the programs. As a rule, you are eligible for aid if:

-You are enrolled at least half-time as a regular student in an eligible program at one of the more than 7,000 colleges, vocational or technical schools or hospital schools of nursing that take part in Department of Education financial aid programs.

-You are a U.S. citizen or an eligible non-citizen. An eligible non-citizen includes someone who is a U.S. national, but is not a citizen; a U.S. permanent resident who has an Alien Registration Receipt Card; or a permanent resident of the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands or the Northern Mariana Islands.

-You can show that you have a need for help. Need is generally defined as the difference between the amount your education will cost and

the amount your family can reasonably be expected to contribute.

The Department of Education has a 16-page pamphlet explaining the aid programs available and the steps you must take to qualify. Copies are available at no charge from the Consumer Information Center, Dept. 512K, Pueblo, Colo., 81009. Ask for: "The Student Guide: Five Federal Financial Aid Programs 1982-83."

To apply for help, you will have to fill out one of several standard forms, including the U.S. Department of Education's Application for Federal Student Aid, known as AFSA; the College Scholarship Service's Financial Aid Form, called FAF; and the American College Testing Program's Family Financial Statement, dubbed FFS.

If you use any of the forms except the government's AFSA, you will have to check a separate box to make sure that the appropriate information is sent to the Department of Education. The government form is free; you will have to pay a processing fee for most of the other forms.

If you are seeking aid for the 1982-83 academic year, you must submit your federal student aid application in time for it to be received by March 15, 1983 at the latest.

About four to six weeks after you apply for federal student aid, you should receive a Student Aid Report, or SAR. This report will show you whether you are eligible for a basic Pell Grant. (The Pell Grant program is the largest of the federal student aid programs; awards generally are closely linked to income.) The financial aid officer at your college also may use the SAR to decide whether you are eligible for other types of help.
