# Committee caps tuition increase at 9 percent

UK has been limited to a tuition increase of 9
percent or less for the 2007-08 school year after a
vote by the Executive Committee of the Council
on Postsecondary Education on Monday.
Thomas Layzell, president of the council, said
the decision only sets the boundaries and does not
dictate exactly how much the increase will be.
"What the council does is establish parameters
so this is the outside limit for what they can
charge;" Layzell said.
The cap defines the limit earlier in the year
than normal and gives students and administrators
a better idea of how much money they will have
only the stable of the students and administrators
a better idea of how much money they will have
"For UK, they have to know how much tuition
will cost so they know how much scholarship
money is available," said Ryam Quarles at UK, law
student who serves as student repreceduates. The
earlier you know about expenses, the better prepared you can be."

This is the second year the council has passed
tuition caps for state universities.
"Before this tuition policy, universities could
set their tuition at whatever they wanted," Quarles
said. "The policy that was voted on yesterday
(Monday) is an extension of this."

Last year, the final determination on the tution increase came from the Board of Trustees in
March, when the board voted to increase tuition
by 12 percent
Quarles said determining the upper limit of the
increase this early is a benefit in itself.

"This helps everybody," Quarles said. "It adds
transparency to the tuition will be next year."

Layzell said the increase works with the Kentucky General Assembly's budget and the allotment for UK in line with the Top 20 Business
Plan.

"The 9 percent at UK really ties into their
business plan," Layzell said. "They indicated to
the general assembly that if they got a certain
amount of funding, which they did, they would





The only way UK could increase tuition by more than 9 percent is by being granted an exception by the council, which Layzell said is unlikely, and not just for UK.

"I don't think we're going to be granting any exceptions," he said, adding that this is only a one-year extension. "When it comes to 2008-09 we will take another look."

UK Spokesman Jay Blanton said because of the funding from the state and the tuition app. UK will stand firm on a single-digit tuition increase. "The legislature stepped up and fully funded the plan for the second year of the biennium," Blanton said. 

## **New Orleans project** benefits community, architecture students

praise they're getting from both the


university and the New Orleans community.

## Minimum wage editorial misleading

Minimum wage editorial misleading

The Kernel editorial from Nov. 27 about the minimum wage was disingenuous, misleading and just plain wrong.

First, the Kernel states that "few minimum wage increases actually pass through state legislative chambers." While that statement may be technically true (most minimum wage brease it is false. In fact, 17 states and the District of Columbia have minimum wages higher than the federal rate.

Next, the Kernel claims that a minimum wage hike would result in a loss of jobs among young and unskilled workers. This is a contested theory. The Fiscal Policy Institute released a report in March of this year claiming that "employment and payrolls in small businesses grew faster in the states with minimum wages above the federal level than in the remaining states."

Even the statistics cited by the Kernel help to prove this problem is manufactured — a 10 percent increase in the minimum wage would only reduce the amount of hours demanded by 1 to 2 percent, meaning that actual money made would increase.

Finally, the Kernel cites the decline in the minimum wage in real terms, but trumpets the increase in the median hourly wage. This is contradictory.






