Communism 56.4%
Fascism 43.6%

When the same question was asked to the entire nation a little more than a year ago by the American Institute of Public Opinion, exactly opposite results were shown.

Everywhere at least a bare majority favored Communism, though there were variations, as seen below:
East Central 50.7%
New England 50.9%
Far West 53.6%
West Central 59.3%
South 61.8%

Southern Women Can't See Daughters As Servants

If servants were given decent hours, attractive uniforms and called "Miss," nearly two thirds of the women of America would be willing to have their daughters go into domestic service.

This was revealed in a nationwide survey of feminine opinion conducted by the Ladies' Home Journal. The only dissent on this question came from Southern women, college graduates and with incomes over \$1,000, who opposed the idea by bare majorities.

Lexington Sites Recall City's Colorful History

Within the city limits of Lexington stand homes and buildings whose walls hold a past crowded with colorful figures and events since the tiny blockhouse, the first permanent settlement, was built on what later was to become the southeast corner of Main and Mill streets.

The apartment house at 326 Grosvenor avenue was formerly the home of Senator John Pope. A century ago President James Monroe, Gen. Andrew Jackson and Isaac Shelby were numbered among its distinguished guests.

Next to the court house square where the Lexington Rifles drilled in their heyday, the statue of John Cabell Breckinridge faces the traffic on Main street, a constant reminder
