The Wisconsin Historical Records Survey, under the National direction of Sargent B. Child, is engaged in a Nation-wide survey of the records of State and local governmental units. This work was initiated in January 1936 as a part of the Federal Writers Project of the Works Progress Administration (title changed to Work Projects Administration on July 1, 1939). In Wisconsin the project began operation in February 1936 and on July 1, the present supervisor was appointed. In August 1936 the Survey became an independent part of Federal Project No. 1. Since September 1939 the Survey in Wisconsin has been a State-wide project sponsored by the University of Wisconsin and the State Historical Society of Wisconsin.

The objective of the Survey in Wisconsin has been the preparation of complete inventories of the records of the State offices, of county, city, and other local governmental units, of church records, of American imprints and newspapers, and of manuscript depositories and collections.

When the American Imprints Inventory was started in the spring of 1937, two final results were anticipated. The first was to be a file or Union Catalog of title slips which would represent the holdings of American libraries to the limiting dates for each State in the fields of books, pamphlets, and broadsides printed in the United States. The second was to consist of published check lists drawn from this material, covering the publications of the various States and certain cities, within certain periods.

The master file of title slips has been built up until it now contains more than 14,000,000 typed slips, representing possibly 1,000,000 separate titles printed in the period of American printing to 1877 in all States but Arizona, Utah, Nevada, Idaho, Wyoming, Montana, and the Dakotas. In these States the limiting date is 1891, because of the later start that printing had in them. Work is continuing in several States in making additions to this file, has been completed in some States, and has been discontinued in others.

Under the direction of Mr. Douglas C. McMurtrie, Consultant from the beginning of the Inventory until July 15, 1941, the second phase, that of publication of check lists, was chiefly confined to the editing and issuance of them in the more complex Style "A" form in the central filing office in Chicago, where the editorial staff is located. The Style "A" lists, requiring title page line endings and printers' devices and bibliographical notes, require an almost endless amount of research, both in the libraries where the books are located and in the huge file which complements them in the central office.

It had become apparent, on the basis of possible publication of Style "A" lists by either the central office or the various States, that if the more than a million titles so far harvested from American libraries were to be made available to the public, some swifter method of issuing the check lists must be found. Two solutions seemed possible: that of abandoning the complex Style "A" lists and issuing simple Style "B" lists which would provide the user with all pertinent information on the title of the book and its location,

author, printer, and date of publication, or the return of the title slips to the States themselves for issuance of Style "A" lists of their own titles. The former solution would have speeded up publication to a considerable extent in the central editing office. The latter would have provided twenty or thirty Style "A" lists at the end of a year, some of which might have been of questionable quality because of the limitations involved in personnel and sources for necessary research.

A study of the problem has convinced the central office of the Historical Records Survey Projects in Washington that the answer may lie in combining the two solutions, that is, the issuance by the various States of their own titles in simplified Style "B" check lists which can at a later time be refined by them or by interested scholars. To this end, a manual of editing has been written and furnished the various States. In more than twenty States the staffs have given assurance that such simplified editing is possible and have requested that their material be sent from the central files.

In March 1942, title to the American Imprints Inventory central files located in Chicago was transferred to the Library of Congress, and the materials moved to the Wisconsin State Historical Society for the duration.

The field work of the American Imprints Inventory started in Wisconsin in September 1938 and we have completed the inventory of approximately 95% of the depositories in the State. There is only one large library, Lawrence College, which was not inventoried. Along with the public depositories, we inventoried many private libraries and several institutional libraries. We have attempted at all times to get a complete inventory of all the Wisconsin imprints found in the State. We have made every effort to get a complete listing of titles and depositories, but no doubt several titles have escaped our searchers. In Wisconsin we estimate that we have checked some eight million books in this State located in approximately 900 public and private collections. In view of the fact that the work of the imprints inventory in many of the States is in various stages of completion, we are not able to list all of the depositories for some of the titles.

In the style and make-up of the volume, we have followed, as closely as possible, the editorial instructions of the National Consultant of the American Imprints Inventory work of the Historical Records Survey. The number assigned to the volume is the numerical order of the publication for the volumes of the imprints survey. The date limits covered in each volume have been arbitrarily set. We compile a list of 500 titles for each volume. In the case of this volume, we have 551 titles for the years 1850-1854. In listing the imprints, we have followed a straight chronological order and we have published them in order according to date of publication. As mentioned above, the policy of the Survey regarding the publication of imprints volumes is to publish in the simplified Style "B" form, unless the information for the Style "A" titles has been completed. In the case of this volume, about 40% of the entries are Style "A".

Preface

In this volume of imprints, A Check List of Wisconsin Imprints, 1850-1854, we have not included briefs and cases. There are about 600 titles of briefs and cases for this period and it is hoped that at a later date we may be able to publish separate volumes on briefs and cases. Wherever field notes fail to designate the library symbol or show some symbol in full in the list of symbols, such imprints were excluded. After the stencils for this volume were cut, we found that entry #213 was the same as #205 and therefore it was deleted. Entry #475 properly belongs between entries #178 and #174, but we did not discover this error in arrangement until after the stencils for the entire volume were cut. We believe it sufficient to call attention to this in the Preface. The titles in this volume have not been checked with the Union Catalog.

We have added two appendixes to the regular volume: In Appendix A are listed the entries about which there is doubt as to place or date, etc. of printing. Appendix B includes the open entries—that is, the volumes published through a series of years, but the publication was started previous to 1854. If we could have had time to expand these entries, either into Style "A" or Style "B", we would have added many more imprints to this volume. At the end of the volume we have prepared a general subject, author, and title index.

The field work of the inventory was completed by the workers on the Wisconsin Historical Records Survey Project. The preliminary editorial work was under the supervision of Miss Sarah E. Gallagher and the final editorial work was under the immediate supervision of Mr. Hans Gaebler.

The Survey wishes to acknowledge with appreciation the assistance of all the librarians in Wisconsin. We are especially indebted to the members of the staff of the State Historical Society of Wisconsin, the Milwaukee Public Library, and the Wisconsin Library Commission.

The Survey also acknowledges with appreciation the assistance and support of the State Director of Community Service Programs and the Chief of the Research and Records Programs of the Work Projects Administration in Wisconsin. The assistance given to us in editorial matters by the National office of the project and by the National Consultant of the American Imprints Inventory is, of course, greatly appreciated.
