Session aims to help combat rape

Gender issues relating to rape were discussed in an open forum yesterday that gathered about 50 students in the Student Center.

* Kristen Kehl, facilitator of the forum, used the meeting to educate students about rape.

"I don't think enough is known about (rape)," Kehl said. "People feel they know about it, but they really know when they hear the facts.

facts.

"Hopefully the differences will be understood and we can start to fix the differences and understand the differences, which will help to

decrease the number of date rapes."

Some of the statistics presented by Robert Ferguson, staff psychologist at the UK Counseling Testing Center, were that 12 percent of college women have been raped. Of that percentage, only 5 to 10 percent were reported. Three types of rape were discussed during the forum: date rape, acquaintance rape and stranger rape. The distinction between the first two is the relationship. Date rape occurs during a relationship with whom another person has affection, whereas acquaintance rape happens when ship. Stranger rape happen

not have any affectionate relation-ship.

Tammy Sulik, an education and counseling coordinator at the Rape Crisis Center, agreed with Ferguson.

Sulik said the best thing a person could do was tell their friend they believe the rape occurred. Another thing was to tell the victim they were sorry that it happened to them.

"It sounds simple but it's an amazing relief to tell another person that it happened," Sulik said.

Sulik added if the rape had occurred minutes before they heard about it and wanted to press charges, the friend should take the person to a hospital to have a physical examination for evidence, shower, go to the bathroom or change clothes before going to the hospital, she said.

Having spent a few years out there before returning to law school, I can assure you that you will be spending more of your time working for the government then you will be for yourself. Let's take a hypothetical senior from last year named Earl Johnson. Earl graduated from UK and decided to open his own lawn mower repair shop in Lexington. Business is incredibly good this year because people are running their mowers on reformulated gasoline. In fact, Earl nets \$100,000 this year. (Although this number may be a bit inflated, I am using an easy number for those of you who may have studied math in the era of keRA.) You may also like to know that Earl worked 60 hours with allowed him to earn about \$32 per hour without any benefits. If Earl had lived in Ft. Wayne, Ind., a city the same size of Lexington, he would have paid \$1,909 loss in local taxes. Isn't Lexington a great city to work in?

Now comes Frankfort, which expects Earl to have money to spare for the Commonwealth. Kentucky mandates that Earl pay \$5,780 for the privilege of working in Kentucky. But, if Earl had lived in Indiana, he would have paid only \$3,400, a difference of \$2,380.

Now comes Bill Clinton demanding that Earl feel the pain of the federal government and to pay his fair share.

First, Earl has to pay his income tax. For Earl, who will only take the single person deduction and no others, his April 15th bill comes to about \$26,000. Earl must also pay his Social Security and Medicate taxes, which equals 15.3 percent of wages. That costs

a whopping \$15,300, for a program that will in all likelihood nexist by the time Earl retires. (I admit that for non-self employed people, this amount is only \$7,650, but remember, the employer has to match it so the government gets the same amount, Just remember that any tax paid on Earl's behalf might as a well have been paid by Earl. Should Earl have been employed instead of being self-employed, his employer would be required by the government to pay \$15,000 to \$20,000 for the privilege of paying Earl Should. 
