



# Northwest crabbers pursue the Pacific's 'deadliest catch'

SEATTLE — They head out to sea in pursuit of a crab's sweet meat. Months of sleep-deprived labor can pull in hundreds of thousands of dollars for a top-grossing vessel. Their death toll — 17 lives lost in the past seven years — makes this the most lethal Pa-

cife harvest.

These are not the Bering Sea crab-bers who gained fame on the Discovery Channels reality series. "Deadliest Channels reality series." "Deadliest Catch," but the Dungeness-crab crews who to ili an anomymity off the Washing-ton and Oregon coasts. Since 2000, their death rate has been 50 percent higher than that of Bering Sea crabbers and four times the rate of all U.S. fishermen, federal statis-tics show.

"We're the deadliest catch," says Mike Banks, the Oregon skipper of the "We're the deadliest catch," says Mike Banks, the Oregon skipper of the 38-foot Alexa B, which this month joined several hundred crabbers for the opening of the new Dungeness season off Oregon and part of Washington. "We're fishing in the Pacific Ocean, where the storms blow 3,000 miles in from Jana"

where the storms blow 3,000 miles in from Japan."

These Northwest crabbers take pride in a fishery that still has room for the little guy, who can break into the harvest with far less capital than required to fish the Bering Sea. Most Northwest crab boats range in length from 30 to 80 feet, far smaller than most Bering Sea crab boats, which can reach more than 180 feet.

Both fleets face severe weather this time of year, when the crabs are at their prime. Bering Sea squalls can coat gear and decks with freezing spray, making boats dangerously top-heavy. That's rare on Northwest Waters, but the local fleet still gets rocked by storms.

The administration should not have placed construction of new parking, hospital and research facilities ahead of solving the dormitory problem, especially since the cost of the latter is only a fraction of any of the former.

As much as tuition rises each year, undergraduates are not receiving the quality education they deserve from the university.

According to UK Institutional Research data, the fall 2006 student-to-faculty ratio was an abysmal 17.9 to 1, which led to large class sections: 265 sections had between 50 and 99 students, and 140 of them had over 100 students.

An inadequate number of faculty members also means more teaching assistants running undergraduate courses. Nothing against TAs, but last time I checked, college students are generally expected to be taught by professors.

generally expected to be taught by professors.

Additionally, the administration should review its approach on achieving diversity on campus.

Diversity is more than a person's skin color, and UK's efforts should not stop at displaying publicity photos featuring minority students.

One largely overlooked source of diversity on campus is the graduate student population.

Together, international and minority students seeking master's de-

Together, international and mi-nority students seeking master's de-grees numbered at 595 in 2006, and those seeking doctoral or profession-

al degree numbered over 1,000, according to data from the Office of Institutional Research.

These graduate students embody more than racial diversity, Many of them are from a foreign culture, followed fifterent traditions and religious practices, and speak English as a second language.

However, these students currently have little involvement on campus.

To integrate these graduate students into the college community, the administration should create programs and activities that are inviting to them. Since many international students do not speak English fluently, programs should be created to help them learn English while getting involved on campus.

These activities would help the graduate students make their experience at UK more enjoyable. The UK community benefits as a whole from these students active presence and contribution; and if anything, UK Public Relations will be able to snap numerous photos that genuinely capture diversity.

Ultimately, achieving diversity comes down to each individual.



# SQ3R Method for studying

Get the best overall picture of Get the best overain picture of what you're going to study before you study it an any detail. It's like looking at a road map before going on a trip. If you don't know the territory, studying a map is the best way to begin.

Ask questions for learning. The important things to learn are usually answers to questions. Questions should lead to emphasis on the what, why, how, when, who and where of study content. Ask yourself questions as you read or study. As you answer them, you will help to make sense of the material and remember it more easily because the process will make an impression on you.

easily because the process will make an impression on you.

Those things that make impres-sions are more meaningful, and there-fore more easily remembered.

Don't be afraid to write your ques-tions in the margins of textbooks, on lecture notes, or wherever it makes sense.

Reading is NOT running your eyes over a textbook. When you read, read actively. Read to answer questions you have asked yourself or questions the instructor or author has asked. Always be alert to bold or italicized

print. The authors intend that this material receive special emphasis.

Also, when you read, be sure to read everything, including tables, graphs and illustrations. Often times tables, graphs and illustrations can

The SQ3R method has been a proven way to sharpen study skills.

"SQ3R" stands for Survey, Question, Read, Recite, Review.

Take a moment now and write SQ3R down. It's a good slogan to commit to memory to carry out an effective study strategy.

When you recite, you stop reading periodically to recall what you have read. Try to recall main headings, important ideas of concents presented. Recite

When you recite, you stop reading periodically to recall what you have read. Try to recall main headings, important ideas of concepts presented in bold or italicized type, and what graphs charts or illustrations indicate.

Try to develop an overall concept of what you have read in your own words and thoughts. Try to connect things you have just read to things you already know.

When you do this periodically, the chances are you will remember much more and be able to recall material for papers, essays and objective tests.

A review is a survey of what you have covered. It is a review of what you are supposed to accomplish, not what you are going to do.

Rereading is an important part of the period process.

the review process.

Reread with the idea that you are Reread with the idea that you are measuring what you have gained from the process. During review, it's a good time to go over notes you have taken to help clarify points you may have missed or don't understand.


The best time to review is when you have just finished studying something. Don't wait until just before an examination to begin the review process.

process.

Before an examination, do a final Before an examination, do a final review. If you manage your time, the final review can be thought of as a "fine-tuning" of your knowledge of the material.

Thousands of high school and college students have followed the SQ3R steps to achieve higher grades with less stress.
