Dr. Lewis W. Cochran, Provost, announced to the Senate that the Board of Trustees, at its meeting of May 2, 1967, had established a Faculty Memorial Scholarship for the children of deceased full-time faculty members; that it will provide tuition and fees for all undergraduate students who might presently be in the University, for those presently below collegiate age, and for those who may be presently enrolled in another institution who are academically admissible and transfer to this institution.
