

Internet privacy best protected by industry, FTC says

WASHINGTON — The Federal Trade Commission indicated Wednesday that it would leaved it to data-mining Web companies and Internet marketers to decide how best to protect users' privacy. "Self-regulation may be the preferable approach for this dynamic marketplace," Lydia Parnes, the director of the commission's Bureau of Consumer Protection, told a Senate committee.
