Paper cuts not in campus green plan

From syllabi to schedule books, paper is used in large quantities every day on campus, but going paperless is not in the university's plans for sus-

paperless is not in the university's plans for sustainability.

UK has not established a campus-wide initiative to decrease paper use at this time, said UK spokeswoman Gail Hairston.

According to a report from the UK Purchasing Department, the university spent \$1 million on paper during its last fiscal year.

The report included all paper purchases made with university funds, including the UK Chandler and UK Good Samaritan hospitals.

The biggest use of paper was in the Information Management Department in the UK Hospital, which spent \$41.451 this last fiscal year. The College of Pharmacy spent the most out of all the colleges on campus with \$17.232. The Colleges of Education and Nursing followed with over \$12,000 each.

UK currently does not limit paper use in individual departments, but some offices are taking their own initiatives to cut down on costs.

UK's Student Billing Services stopped sending paper bills to students as of Feb. 1, 2008. Recently, the Registrar's office published the schedule book exclusively online and plans to move the university bulletin from print to electronic. But this decision was made by the Registrar's office without a push from the university, said Bruce Manley, associate registrar.

"We made the decision to go paperless internally," Manley said." It was not something that has been mandated from higher authorities."

The idea to eliminate paper schedule books has already shown it will be beneficial, Manley said.

"Between not printing schedule books and undergraduate bulletins, we will save the university \$80,000 per year," he said.

The 20 departments that spent the most on paper accounted for nearly 30 percent of UK's paper expenses. After moving to paperless billing, the student billing services department consumed \$1,545 in paper, and the purchasing division, which sent the 256 page budget report electronically, spent \$3,548 on paper. The Library Administration spent \$9,475.

Sculpture to display the Year 2007-2008 culture of coal

A new sculpture in the UK Art Museum sculpture garden is aiming to use coal to relate Kentucky and some African cultures.

The sculpture, "Coal Poi," was designed by contemporary artist El Anatsui, who was a visting artist at UK in 2003. While he was on campus, he had the idea for a sculpture that could connect the African and Kentuckian experiences with coal.

"This piece refers to his own culture, of cooking in coal pots, and the idea of coal being so important to Kentuckian experiences with coal.

"It Anatsui was born in Ghana and is a professor of sculpture at the University of Nigeria. He is known for using recyclable materials, Welker said, and this piece is made of an iron "cauldron" that will contain "massive pieces of coal."

The coal was donated by Ikerd Coal. Welker said the coal will slowly disintegrate and fall through the cup, which represents another aspect of the piece.

The coal will eventually need to be replaced, but not for decades, "if not longer," Welker said.

The iron fixture was cast by UK associate professor of sculpture Garry Bibb. Funding for the project came from collaboration between the Art Museum and the UK Art Department.

The cauldron was installed Monday in the UK Art Museum and the coal pieces will be placed inside on Thursday.

WK was ranked the 55th most sexually healthy school out of 130 U.S. colleges in the annual Trojan Sexual Health Report Card. This rank improved 39 spots since UK placed 89th in last year's survey.

The survey was not a measure of safe-sex activity but a measure of a school's efforts to keep students educated about sexual health, said Bert Sperling, president of Sperling's BestPlaces, the research firm that conducted the survey.

"It measured how much information is provided so the students can make their own best decisions regarding their sexual practices," Sperling said. The report gave each college a grade point average based on the services offered to students based on the colleges Web ales, susteinmarks, completed by administrators, completed by administrators,

dent responses gathered by advertising on Facebook and an evaluation of the actual services offered to students.

Some of the factors that determined GPA were the availability and cost of condoms and other contraceptives on campus, STD testing and sexual awareness programs.

other contraceprives on cam-pus, STD testing and sexual awareness programs. Researchers' evaluations and student responses were of-en very similar, Sperling said. "We took that as a positive corroboration of our results," he said. The overall response to the survey improved from last year, Sperling said. More question-naires were returned by admin-strators and student response increased from about 3,000 stu-dents to 9,000. UK had a GPA of 2,95 compared to the 3.5 GPA of top-ranking Stanford Universi-

Two times in the last three seasons the UK soccer team has finished the season in the top 25. Both times it has failed to make the NCAA Tournament.

Despite making it the Conference USA Tournament championship game — a match they lost in penalty kicks to the No. 7 team in the nation — the Cats failed to receive an at-large bid from the NCAA Selection Committee on Monday.

UK entered last night with a No. 21 ranking, a 12-45 record and a 3-3-2 record against ranked opponents. But ultimately UK's low Ratings Percentage Index cost the Cats a bid into the 48-team tournament, said Bob Bradner, editor of the College Soccer News.




