



BIRTHPLACE OF BOURBON

THE REV. ELIAS PAINE, COVENER OF THE FIRST PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH IN BOURBON, KENTUCKY, WAS BORN IN THIS CABIN IN 1759.

A FUGITIVE FROM VIRGINIA, THE REV. CALLED SET UP HIS GRIST MILL AND CAME TO THE PLACE TO PURCHASE WHEAT BY BORROWING THE COUNTRY. THE FIRST BUSH WHEAT IN THE PRODUCTION OF KENTUCKY.

THE REV. CHURCH WAS DEDICATED AS THE CHURCH OF THE REV. OF GEORGETOWN AND BECAME THE FIRST PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH IN THE WEST OF THE ALLEGHANY MOUNTAINS.
