Doctor's study finds new use for cancer drug

The Food and Drug Administration recently approved a new use for the breast cancer drug Herceptin, thanks in part to the work of a UK researcher.

Dr. Edward Romond, a cancer specialist and researcher at UK's Markey Cancer Center, was the lead investigator on a project that researched and analyzed two clinical trials of early-stage breast cancer patients who received Herceptin in addition to chemotherapy. Herceptin is a monoclonal antibody that attaches to and prevents actions of human epidermal growth factor receptor 2 (HER-2), a protein that occurs in 25 percent of breast cancer patients, Romond said. HER-2 makes cells grow more agressively and spread faster.

Herceptin had previously been used in combination with chemotherapy to treat women who had more advanced stages of HER-2-positive breast cancer, and in those incompositions of the property of

Professor helps secure funds for suicide prevention

Rentucky is set to receive \$1.2 million over three years to combat the No. 2 cause of death in Kentucky's youth — suicide.

"Kentucky loses twice as many citizens to suicide as it does to homicide and AIDS combined," said Dr. Julic Cerel, an assistant professional professional

named after a current congressman whose son committed suicide. Kentucky was among II states that received part of the funds. The grant will be given to the state in increments of \$400,000 over three years and must be used to target the age range where suicide is most cornomon, people under the age of 24.

The grant will be used in a variety of ways, Cerel said.

This \$24 million new facility should be completed by March 2008, President Lee Todd said Nov. 15. With four floors of 72,000 square feet, it should be a great improvement to the measy 13,000 feet UHS currently holds inside the Kentucky Clinic.

The expanded space in this new facility will allow for increased productivity, improved privacy and expanded health programming for the university community." said Dr. Greg Moore, the director of UHS, in the same UK News article.

Junior center Randolph Morris led the Cats with 20 points and nine rebounds, and scored nine of the game's final 11 points.


The Cats jumped out to an early 10-0 lead behind five points from Ramel Bradley.
