The Faculty met in regular monthly session in the President's room at 8.30 am.

All present except Professors White, W.K. Patterson, Kastle, Pryor, Nelson and Swigert.

The minutes of the previous two meetings were read and approved.

Mr. John J. Gumm made a statement to the Faculty concerning a meeting of veterans <sup>May 10<sup>th</sup></sup> to be held at Woodland Park and requested that any who felt so disposed should contribute something toward their entertainment.

Professor Neville, <sup>chairman of</sup> committee on class honors reports as follows:

Your Committee recommended that the first honor be awarded to Mr. R. L. Pope, and the second honor to Mr. J. C. Frazer.

Also that the Courses of study be represented in the Commencement exercises as follows: Classical Course by R. L. Pope and R. L. Gordon,

Mechanical Engineering Course by W. A. Duncan and G. F. Blessing

Normal Course by Miss Lula Sealey and Mr. G. C. Downing.

The report was received and adopted with the provision that all speeches and essays be limited to ten minutes.

Ordered that the members of the class, this year, be permitted to elect one of their number to represent them in a speech of not more than ten minutes duration in the Commencement exercises.

Professor Milha raised some questions concerning the time required by students to complete the studies in the Classical Course, in this connection the case of Mr. J. S. Johnson was mentioned.

Ordered that the questions raised be referred to the Classical Faculty for its consideration at a meeting to be held within a few days
