FOREWORD

FINANCIAL

In presenting this report we follow the yearly custom, exacted by our auditors, of giving our supporters a complete accounting of all our affairs. The audits have not been condensed, the gifts of the 2126 subscribers are acknowledged by name,* except where anonymity was requested, and donations in kind as well as in money are reported in full. The annual inventory of the property of the organization is recorded, and the value of the property estimated.

NURSING

The report closes with a detailed statement of the work of the nursing service. Through prevention of disease or caring for the sick in all 7,806 people, in 1,675 families, have been attended by the Service. The nurse-midwives have also delivered 347 women in childbirth without the loss of a single mother.** Friends who look back to last year's annual report will see that the increase in nursing work carried by the organization has been met by an equal increase in 627 new subscribers.

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year was overwhelmingly greater than the former for us, because of the destitution of the majority of our people. Not only did we have hundreds of men back from the railroads without work, but many of our people were in such acute distress from the great drought that only Red Cross relief kept them alive. In this way the past fiscal year is typical of nothing that ever came before and probably will not be repeated again in a hundred years. The extra burdens this put upon our organization have no parallel. Before the Red Cross came in upon its mission of mercy in January we had in our territory many families without food. We met this situation in the late summer and through the autumn by an increase in building, and on that alone we spent \$35,281. We had at times nearly a hundred men, all heads of families, in our employ. That was our first and foremost contribution to drought relief. The stricken families got work (which was all they asked for) and we have the buildings, which would not have been the case if we had given money instead of work. In addition to this large expenditure, we had to give milk and cod liver oil to over two thousand expectant mothers and young children over a period of months, and considerably more in clothing and shoes than we usually give during the Christmas season. All of this had to be found over and above our regular budget, which was not reduced in any particular. And such was the understanding generosity of our friends that every penny we needed was given us, or loaned without security, and is now accounted for in full.

We are happy to report that the drought is completely a thing of the past; that gardens and crops have never been better nor people more eager and enthusiastic in harvesting them. But, although food will be abundant during the coming year, the after effects of the drought are still upon us: first, in the heavy mortgages most of the people have had to put on their little farms and cannot clear off until they have found employment; secondly, in an increase in nutritional diseases and a

marked increase in miscarriages among the expectant mothers. Our State Health Officer tells up that this last has been observed as characteristic of periods of near-famine since the Irish potato famine in 1846.

NATIONAL TRUSTEES

Among the significant changes of the past year is the reorganization of our Board of Trustees into a National body* and the formation of a National Medical Council and a National Nursing Council composed of distinguished members of both professions who have consented to serve in this capacity. Our revised Articles of Incorporation arrange for the election annually of the Executive Committee by these trustees and the election of new trustees in the future from our various committees. This is a policy both broad and democratic and it places the affairs of the Frontier Nursing Service directly in the hands of those most concerned with its program, upon an equitable basis.

A TRAINING FIELD

We are constantly asked to supply nurses with Frontier Nursing Service training and experience to other groups in the Appalachian Mountains working in educational and religious fields. We supplied a nurse for two years to a mission station in Virginia which met the entire cost of her service. The increase in these demands, coupled with requests from two directions for experienced nurse-midwives to teach in training schools is bringing us gradually into the second phase of our program—namely, the use of our well-organized territory as a training field for the extension of our work at any strategic point ready to receive it through any group able to finance it. From the beginning we have intended to have our own training

school in a near-by city as a first step, and our next point of departure must follow this trend.

OZARK SURVEY

When the Frontier Nursing Service began its initial program in Kentucky, it incorporated in its charter at the outset its hope that the policies it originated and adopted would be applicable in other parts of remotely rural America, and its aim to give them a national field of application much broader than the Kentucky mountains alone. When we received, therefore, a request from our St. Louis Committee to survey certain Ozark mountain counties with the view to determining their availability for an extension of our field of work, we accepted the commission as part of our national program. This study, financed in full by the St. Louis Committee,* was carried out during the past year by the Assistant Directors, Miss Gladys Peacock and Miss Mary B. Willeford, and an experienced secretary, Miss Wilma Duvall, and the area covered comprised four contiguous mountain counties in Missouri and three in Arkansas.

We had the cordial cooperation of Dr. C. W. Garrison, Arkansas State Health Officer, and Dr. James Stewart, Missouri State Health Officer, and the Executive Board of the Missouri State Medical Association which called a special meeting for this purpose, and many private citizens in the Ozarks region. The tabulations in full are in the hands of the St. Louis chairman, Mr. Harry French Knight, and the three interested Public Health and Medical groups. The tabulated conclusions, embodied in this report, will repay careful study by anyone interested in rural economics. The conditions are, we estimate, fully ten times better than in the Kentucky mountains because of the topography (wide open plateaus on the tops of mountains), enabling cheaper road construction and, consequently, better schools, better markets and improved economic conditions, and a more available medical service.

Naturally, any expansion during the present year would be impossible for the Frontier Nursing Service, but even when that expansion becomes possible we feel that the small group

method under expert supervision will lend itself better to the variability of local conditions throughout the immense American rural field than a mechanical repetition of our first demonstration unit. When we go into the Ozarks and mountainous sections in other states it will probably be in close cooperation with local as well as state groups, and on a local basis—selecting always a region eager to receive the services the Frontier Nursing Service renders.

NEAR-BY COOPERATION

The most moving form of cooperation ever asked of us is when organizations sponsoring educational and religious teaching in or near our territory ask us to supply their nursing service. We have for years had this form of cooperation with the Presbyterian center at Hyden; and, during the past year, we have effected an affiliation with the Evangelical settlement at Beverly, in Bell County, at the head of Red Bird River. For a long time past our most available medical service at the Jessie Preston Draper Center in Leslie County and the Caroline Butler Atwood Center in Clay, has been the help unfailingly rendered by Dr. Harlan S. Heim of the Beverly settlement. At his request, we have during all of the past year maintained a nurse-midwife at the Beverly settlement, working directly under him and carrying his normal confinements, while he has given increased clinical services to our two remote centers which are nearer him than to our own doctor at Hyden. This arrangement has been mutually of the happiest and it continues with warm satisfaction on both sides.

The Sixth Annual Report of the Frontier Nursing Service, Inc., is herewith presented to its subscribers and supporters by the officers and trustees.

REPORT OF THE NURSING WORK of the FRONTIER NURSING SERVICE

May 1, 1930 to April 30, 1931

The work of the Frontier Nursing Service during the past year was handled by 28 nurses who worked a total of 311 3/10 months. This includes 5 assistant directors and supervisors; 20 district nurse-midwives (including floaters and relief nurses); and 3 hospital nurses (including the superintendent).

The district nurses worked a total of 238 1/6 months. This includes the time spent on duty only and not vacation or sick leave, or absence for study, or in visiting for observation. The work is outlined briefly below.

During the past year, we have changed our records to conform to the newest classification of a baby as up to one year of age, and a pre-school or "toddler" from one to six years of age. We have kept a special classification of the first month of life to correspond with the maternity cases, which are not closed out under a month.

At the close of the fiscal year, 7,806 people in 1,675 families had been attended by the Service. Of these 2,055 were babies under one year of age and toddlers from one to six years of age; and 2,658 were school children.

The total number of children followed was....4,713

Bedside nursing care has been given 459 very sick people, of whom 34 died and 350 recovered.

The district nurses paid 27,892 visits to 17,250 families, and received 19,935 visits at the nursing centers. The entire nursing staff was on duty 58,837 hours.

There have been 59 patients and their attendants transported to Lexington, Richmond, Louisville, and Cincinnati, on

passes given them and their nurses by the Louisville and Nashville Railroad.

The little hospital at Hyden was occupied 3,086 days by 436 patients.

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MIDWIFERY:

The nurse-midwives have delivered 347 women in childbirth (including one miscarriage) of 343 live babies during the year, and have given them pre-natal and post partum care. There were seven stillbirths. We report, with deep thankfulness, that there has been no maternal death.

Doctors were called in 14 times for the following abnormal conditions: One persistent posterior; three lacerations of perineum; three delayed second stage; one pre-eclamptic; one premature labor; two forceps; one retained placenta; one premature rupture of the membranes; and one collapse.

The midwifery cases closed during the year were 400. There were admitted 398 new cases. One hundred and six midwifery cases are registered at the present date, and carried forward as expectant mothers.

PUBLIC HEALTH

CONFERENCES:

At 404 meetings for group work or conferences, there was a known attendance of 1,944 men, women and children; at 12 public gatherings there was an estimated attendance of 2,269.

FIELD CLINICS:

There were held during the year 276 field clinics, with a known attendance of 13,166 men, women and children; and 1 field clinic with an estimated attendance of 75.

At the request of the State Board of Health, and under the direction of the County Health Officer in one of the counties (Leslie), the nurses gave 16,602 inoculations in Clay, Leslie, Perry and Bell Counties, as follows:

SUMMARY OF WORK IN HELMINTHOLOGY

August-September, 1930

Under the direction of Dr. Paul Lampson, a group of pharmacologists and helminthologists, namely, Dr. Gilbert Otto, financed by The American Child Health Association through Johns Hopkins University, and Drs. Harold Brown and B. H. Robbins, financed by The Rockefeller Foundation through Vanderbilt University, have been working out during the past year a piece of research leading to the study and control of hookworm, roundworm and other intestinal parasites, in co-operation with the Frontier Nursing Service.

As this study takes at least a year for its completion the full report of it will not be given until 1932. However, we can state that the stools of 820 people (nearly all children) were examined in August-September, 1930, and 80.5% were found to have intestinal parasites including hookworm, roundworm, whipworm, dwarf tapeworm and pinworm. All were treated with a new drug which is being used in this study. The subsequent examinations of stools over a period of a year are to determine both the degree of return of infestation, and of the "full burden" of infestation, as well as the time taken for these returns.

RESOLUTION ON THE DEATH OF DR. J. A. STUCKY

Adopted by the Frontier Nursing Service at its semi-annual meeting in Lexington, Kentucky, June 30th, 1931.

It is with profound sorrow that we record the death of Dr. J. A. Stucky, our trustee and loyal and devoted friend. He combined with his national standing as a specialist in diseases of the eyes, ears, nose and throat, a position of preeminence as an authority on trachoma. To the understanding and eradication of this terrible disease he gave without remuneration a great part of his life, and thousands of blind people see the light today because of the work he did.

Both as a physician and as a speaker before distinguished gatherings from New York to California, Dr. Stucky served the Frontier Nursing Service during his six years as trustee; but the qualities which endeared him to us were those of the heart. His was a warm, humane and kindly nature that served people because he loved them. In the spirit of that love we will remember him always.

RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be sent his widow and family with our sympathy and affection, and that a copy be filed with the permanent records of the Frontier Nursing Service.

FORM OF BEQUEST

For the convenience of those who may be willing to remember this institution in their wills, this form of bequest is suggested:

"I hereby devise the sum of
dollars (or property properly described) to the Frontier Nursing Service, a corporation organized under the laws of the State of Kentucky."

It is preferred that gifts be made without restriction, since the Trustees thereby have a broader latitude in making the best possible use of them. Of course, however, they are also welcome where a particular use is prescribed.

To facilitate the making of gifts of this sort, it is suggested that if they come by will there be added to the form shown above some such language as the following:
"This devise is to be used (here describe the purpose.)"

Suggestions for special bequest:

- \$50,000 will endow a field of the work in perpetuity.
- \$12,000 will endow a Frontier hospital bed.
- \$ 5,000 will endow a baby's crib.
- \$10,000 will build and equip a Frontier center for the work of two nurses.
- \$15,000 additional will provide for the upkeep, insurance, repairs and depreciation on this center, *so that*
- \$25,000 will build and maintain in perpetuity a center.

A number of these centers have been given and equipped, and two are already endowed.

Any of the foregoing may be in the form of a memorial in such name as the donor may prescribe, as, for example, the Jane Grey Memorial Frontier Nurse, the Philip Sidney Frontier Hospital Bed, the Raleigh Center, the Baby Elizabeth Crib.

Any sum of money may be left as a part of the Frontier Nursing Service Endowment Fund the income from which will be used for the work of the Service in the manner judged best by its Trustees, and the principal of which will carry the donor's name unless otherwise designated.
