A canvass of the faculty showed that so far as could be discovered no minors had been completed by any of these men. In the case of Mr. Wilson it was reported by the Dean ^{Prof. Mackenzie} that after looking over his work, he felt that he could not recommend him for this degree.

It was proposed that if Mr. Mustaine could show his minor subject satisfactorily completed by Dec. meeting of the Board of Trustees, he should be then recommended to the Board for his master's degree.

Prof. Mackenzie moved that Mr. Whitlock be recommended for this degree provided it be made apparent that he has pursued his minor studies, and that all conditions have been complied with.

Prof. Miller moved as an amendment, seconded by Prof. Wilson, that if Mr. Whitlock satisfies the requirements as to minor subjects by the Dec. meeting of the Board, he be then recommended for the degree of M. A.

The amendment was carried.

The motion as amended was then carried.

It was shown upon evidence submitted by Prof. Row, professor White, and Miss King, ^{Samuel Boing} Secretary, that the records of Mr. ^{Samuel Boing} Coleman, Senior in Civil Engineering, upon the books of the Secretary, had been tampered with in several instances. Mr. ^{S. B.} Coleman was called in and denied any knowledge of the matter.

It was moved by C. E. Mathews, seconded by Prof. M. White that because of insufficient evidence as to the guilt of Mr. Coleman,

he be recommended for the degree of B. C. E.

Prof. Pence, seconded by W. K. Patterson, moved as a substitute that inasmuch as the records in Mr. Coleman's case are shown to have been tampered with, we delay final action, in order to secure if possible further evidence in the case. Upon roll call the substitute was lost, recorded as follows.

The original motion was then ^{voted upon} carried with only one dissenting vote, that of W. K. Patterson.

In order to secure if possible unanimous action, Prof. Miller, seconded by Maj. Buitt, moved a reconsideration. The motion was carried.

Upon a second vote being taken the motion was carried without any dissenting vote.

The meeting adjourned.
