On motion a vote of thanks was accorded to Prof. Shipp of Winchester for his invitation to the the faculty to attend the tournament of the Graded Schools in the Blue Grass region.

E. B. Gaither The third case referred to the faculty by the Board of Discipline was that of Cadet E. B. Gaither charged with discharging a rifle from the window of a Coach on the return from Chattanooga.

On motion of Major Carpenter ordered that Cadet Gaither be given two hours' squad-drill, and one week in arrest.

The 4th case was that of Cadet T. B. Moore charged with repeatedly failing to report for squad-drill. P. a.

T. B. Moore Ordered on motion of Prof. Kastle that Cadet T. B. Moore be required to make good all delinquencies in squad-drills, and that he be put in arrest during the remainder of the term.

H. B. Kelly The 5th case was that of Cadet H. B. Kelly charged with deserting the guard while ^{in camp} at Chattanooga.

On motion of Major Carpenter ordered that Cadet Kelly be given five hours' squad-drill and released from arrest.

Ordered that J.A. Jones be cited to appear before the Board of Discipline to account for his demerits.

The faculty then adjourned to meet at 3pm, May 24, unless otherwise notified.

It appeared upon the records of the Board of Discipline that Cadet Jones had been required to squad-drill when he had accumulated 25 demerits.

whereupon Prof. Wernicke offered the following: In as much as Mr. Jones was required to do squad-drill by the Board of Discipline for accumulating 25 demerits and in as much as this punishment may be construed by the accused and others as a penalty, cancelling the said demerits, although the faculty do not so consider it.
