

Kentucky's Medical Men Are Nationally Known

Kentuckians have needed no outside telling as to the high standards of their professional men, but the National recognition which the past few years has brought to the excellence of her physicians and surgeons cannot fail to be gratifying.

It is just two years since Louisville Dr. Irvin Abell served with distinction as President of the American Medical Association. Now a Lexingtonian, Dr. Fre W. Rankin, has been chosen President elect of the same body, to serve in 1942.
