

I have just returned to my office from the trip out to the convention of the Young Democrats of Kansas and wish to make the following report:

Upon arrival of the plane at Kansas City I was met by John Breidenthal, National Committeeman, John Harvy, President of the Kansas City Young Democrats, and Frank R. Callahan. They immediately took me to Topeka, Kansas where all the necessary arrangements had been made for my convenience.

There was a banquet for the Young Democrats on Saturday evening at 8:30 p.m. and I arrived in time to attend. Prior to the banquet I had the pleasure of meeting several of the Young Democrats of Kansas including the president, Arthur Hodgson, and National Committeewoman Thelma Hunter. The main speaker at the banquet was Senator Josh Lee of Oklahoma and Bill Burke, the defeated Democratic candidate for Governor. There were about 350 in attendance at the banquet, including the State Chairman, State Chairwoman and National Committeeman of the senior organization. Immediately after the banquet there was a dance and floor show.

After the banquet I had occasion to meet and talk with many Young Democrats and was fortunate in being able to discuss the Young Democratic situation in Kansas with the following former State Presidents: Harry Washington, 724 Dwight Bldg., Kansas; Bob Campbell, Box 1695 Wichita; Leah Warner, Cimarron; and Jimmie Brown. Jimmie Brown is now attending Kansas University but I seem to have misplaced his address.

Page Two:

There was quite a heated contest for the election of President and National Committeeman. The election was held Sunday afternoon. The candidates for President were Henry Lueck, of Netawaka; Jim Parnell, of Goodland, and President, Arthur Hodgson. It was necessary to have two ballots before Henry Lueck was elected President. Incidentally, Bob Campbell was his campaign manager.

From observations and also from information procured from those with whom the matter was discussed, it seemed to be the concensus of opinion that the President, Arthur Hodgson took the job after two others had declined and to fill an unexpired term. He did not think he had the time to devote to it even at the time it was taken over and for that reason no reorganization or pepping up of the county organizations was done during his term of office, which necessarily meant that the county organizations were not active and it followed that the state organization lapsed into the same condition. Also, Thelma Hunter, National Committeewoman, shortly after she was elected two years ago, procured a federal job, did not resign, but wanted to retain it for the name, but did not do anything on account of fear of the hatch. It seems that all of the Young Democrats were very much satisfied with the officers elected and Past Presidents, as well as other Young Democrats, are more than anxious to do their parts to get out and work, and believe that there will be an active organization under the present officers.

Page Three:

Both the newly elected National Committeeman and the National Committeewoman promised me that they would attend the National Committee Meeting down at Washington, D.C.

With reference to the check for \$100.00 we now hold, they are going to get a Cashier's Check and bring it down to the National Committee Meeting and clear that up. It seems that there was some misunderstanding with John Bailey at the time this check was given and for that reason he was informed payment would be stopped. There was about \$320.00 in back dues owing and the Kansas Club was under the impression that a compromise of the back dues had been made for the sum of \$100.00 and that was what the check was issued for. They stated this matter would be taken care of at the National Committee Meeting and they will go down the line 100% from now on.

The money received by the state organization is from dues sold by local county clubs and money for dues is paid in to the state organization from the time of the state convention up to February 15th. They think that they will have a sufficient amount of money in within a very short time to pay their charter dues and this is what they are going to do.

From my observations I would say that the names of the Young Democrats and addresses given me, including the officers elected, were probably the most active in the state organization. A list of active women was not procured for the reason that the one who was going to get it never did so, but I am sure that this list can be procured from the recently elected National Committeewoman or the Vice-President, or both.

I sincerely believe that we can expect an active organization from the Young Democrats of Kansas under the leadership of these newly elected officers.






I don't know when I ever had such a good time as I did at Louisville last week-end. Thank you a thousand times for asking me and a million - and then more - times for your many acts of kindness.






