Kentucky State University.
Minutes of the General Faculty.

The faculty convened as usual at 3:30 P. M. with President Barker in the chair, the following members being present:

President Barker, Vice-President White, Professors Anderson, Miller, Norwood, Rowe, Lafferty, Hamilton, Mackenzie, Mathews, Garman, Zembrod, Tuttle, Jones, Peter, Allen, Brown, Healey, Noe, Melcher, Tuthill, Easton, Rhoads, Freeman, Tigert, Kelly, Sweetland, Boyd, Davis, Carrel, Strauss and Gillis.

The minutes of the meeting of Sept. 20th. and Oct. 4th. were read and upon motion adopted.

Commandant Kelly presented the following resolution relative to exemptions from military drill:-

Resolved: That when a student can certify upon his honor that he is working his way through college, and is dependent upon his labor to enable him to continue his studies at this University, the President shall have the power to excuse such student from military instruction, from year to year, during the time when such student is actually at work. Provided: that the said student shall promise, that if at any time it is no longer necessary for him to work he will take up military instruction and make up the period lost, or such part of it as he can make up before quitting the University by graduation or otherwise. If it so happen that the student be excused throughout his entire college course, military science being a required subject, his failure to have received military science will constitute a deficiency which must be removed by the President before the student may receive his degree. Provided: further, that a deficiency in military science, under these conditions shall not be counted as one of those debaring a student from entering the next higher class. Provided further: that in removing deficiencies as herein-before-specified, the President shall give the necessary instructions to the registrar in writing.

By consent the discussion of this resolution was interrupted to take up the discussion of certain questions relating to athletics in order to enable Professor Sweetland to withdraw at an early hour. President Barker announced to the faculty the appointment of a committee on athletics consisting of Dr. Tigert as chairman, Professors Gillis, Curtis and Sweetland. Dr. Tigert explained that

his committee was anxious to eliminate all irregularities in the personnel of the teams to avoid criticism. He said that some irregularities had been discovered last year but the committee wishes to avoid this in the future and desired the earnest cooperation of the faculty to secure this end. President Barker approved this suggestion and urged upon the faculty their earnest cooperation. A question as to the eligibility of Mr. Rodes arose which was discussed by Professors Miller, Lafferty, Allen, Anderson, Norwood and President Barker, the general consensus of opinion being that Mr. Rodes was entitled to play.

The discussion of Commandant Kelly's resolution relating to exemptions from military drill was then resumed and upon motion duly seconded, the resolution was adopted. Commandant Kelly then introduced a second resolution:-

Resolved: That beginning with the College year 1913-1914, that military science be made a required subject in every course that a student may take in the University, which course may require at least two years or more to complete: Provided that bona fide special students and students in Law are excepted: Provided further that those students who enter the two year course in mining and who are bona fide practical miners are exempt.

After a brief discussion upon motion of Prof. Melcher, duly seconded, this resolution was adopted. On motion it was ordered that the reading of the minutes of the council be left over until the next meeting.

Upon motion of Prof. Miller duly seconded, it was ordered that in accordance with the usual custom the lists of candidates for degrees in June next, be filed with the Secretary of the faculty, and that the Secretary furnish a complete list to the registrar who is required to report back to the faculty at the next meeting a list of such candidates as may have conditions against them. Prof. Gillis asked as a matter of information if questions relating to advanced standing in military drill should be referred to the committee on advanced standing or to the Commandant. Prof. Melcher moved that all such questions both in connection with military affairs and regarding physical culture be referred to the heads of these Departments. On being put to vote the motion was lost and Pres. Barker therefore ruled that such questions be referred to the committee on advanced standing. Pres. Barker stated that the executive committee had ordered a revision of the University schedule of studies and therefore appointed as a committee to

arrange and report such revision: Prof. Melcher Chairman, with Professors Boyd, Tuttle, Freeman and Dantzler. On motion the faculty adjourned.
