The faculty met in called session in the Presidents room, in the College building at 3pm.

All present except Prof. Roark and Prof. Wernicke

Object of the meeting: Consideration of New Schedule for Scientific Course, or Courses.

Schedule for Scientific Courses. Prof. Miller moved that the new schedule for the Scientific ^{course} or courses, sanctioned by the Board of Trustees, be put into operation this year. Seconded

Prof. Shackelford offered as a substitute "That the schedule printed in the last Catalogue be followed this year"

Prof. Kastle proposed as an amendment to the substitute; "and that the year be divided into three terms." Amendment accepted.

Substitute motion was then put and lost by ayes and noes. as follows.

Ayes - Shackelford, Neville, Kastle, 3

Noes - White, Pryor, Anderson, Mathews, Miller,

Peuce, Brooks. - 7

Prof. Anderson moved to reconsider the motion, ^{just} lost. The vote was as follows:

Ayes - Shackelford, White, Neville, Kastle, Anderson

Noes - Pryor, Mathews, Miller, Peuce, Brooks, 5

The President voted aye and the motion to reconsider was carried.

Several motions were offered without action.

Prof. Shackelford's substitute was again proposed: slightly modified, by Prof. White, as follows:

"That for the school year 1898-9 the old schedules of studies for the various college courses be followed except that

That the school-year be divided into three terms, and that a committee be appointed to revise and harmonize the various Schedules, the committee to report progress at the regular meeting in October.

Committee White, Matthews, Kettle, Miller and Johnson.
