OTHER TYPES OF LIBRARIES:

The facts presented about public libraries reflect in large measure the situation that exists in the school libraries and in the college and university libraries of Kentucky. Again it is a story of weak libraries receiving inadequate support and offering inadequate services.

MOBILIZING CITIZEN INTEREST

A Citizens Library Movement is now being organized in Kentucky, following the example of other forward-looking states. Its <u>purpose</u> is two-fold, namely, to stimulate local library development, and to mobilize state-wide interest in the extension and improvement of library service. All types of libraries are comprehended in this aim, public, school and college. Its <u>plan</u> is to promote the organization of select laymen into local "Friends of the Library" groups, and to affiliate these local units in a state-wide Citizens Library Movement.
