

MOSCOW — The Soviet Union said the yesterday that a nuclear accident damaged an atomic reactor at the Chernobyl power plant in the Ukraine. Radiation swept across Finland, Denmark and Sweden, more than 750 miles away.

The SGA is the students' voice, and its executive officers and senators — elected by the student body — are the people by whom the UK administration, the Board of Trustees, the Council on Higher Education and maybe even the General Assembly judge what students at the University are thinking.

It's an awesome responsibility — not only for the members of SGA, but for their constituents as well. No one would argue that the student body has a right to participate in its government, but not many seem to realize how imperative it is to do so. Without guidance from students SGA becomes little more than a group of fairly dedicated students who get together every other week.

But the organization has the potential to do much more. Next year will bring a major change in the University's administration — a search for a new vice chancellor for student affairs will be either underway or completed, and President Otis A. Singletary will be retiring — and if those changes will affect anyone, they will affect students. To gauge students' wants and needs, search committees and administrators will undoubtedly turn their ears to SGA, which will need student input to make intelligent recommendations.

Also, SGA will next year have more than \$100,000 to distribute as it sees fit. A great deal of that money will undoubtedly go to bringing more high-quality speakers — like this year's G. Gordon Liddy and Mike Farrell — and to programming like the annual Fall Free For All. But the remainder of the budget will still be a considerable sum, and since that money is coming from students, they should go out of their way to see that it is spent wisely and with their best interests in mind.

Senators should know they have the potential to do excellent things, and should strive to reach high goals. And

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. — Three months after the explosion of space shuttle Challenger, pathologists yesterday completed examination of the remains of the seven crew members and the bodies will be transported today to Delaware to be prepared for burial.

A C-141 aircraft carrying seven flag-draped coffins will depart from the shuttle landing strip this morning for Dover Air Force Base.

Although there will be a military honor guard and escorts from the astronaut corps, no formal ceremony is planned here, and no family members were expected.

"Alt Dover, the remains will be prepared in accordance with the wishes of the individual families," NASA said last week in announcing that the bodies would be moved.

The Dover facility is the east coast receiving and emalming sist for remains of goverment employees, military personnel or their relatives. In most cases, autopsies are performed at the site of death and the embalming or cremation takes place at Dover. ation takes place at Dover

Walker testifies in spy trial

SAN FRANCISCO — Confessed spymaster John Walker, testifying for the prosecution in the Jerry Whitworth espionage trial, said yesterday that depression over marital problems led him to spy for the Soviet Union.

"The marital problems caused a lot of depression in my own life. ... It was ulimately responsible, I believe, for me getting into espionage," the balding, bespectacled Walker told a federal court jury in a packed courtroom.
"I was depressed, and I committed a desperate act. I contacted the Soviet Union, and I agreed to sell secrets to them."

not sure why.

He said he made the decision in early 1968, after 13 years as a communications specialist in the Navy. The prosecution says that six years later, Walker recruited Whitworth, his friend and fellow Navy instructor, to be his chief supplier of classified information

Libyans linked to bombing of club

ANKARA, Turkey — Employees of Libya's embassy supplied hand grenades with which two Libyans planned to attack a U.S. military officers' club in Ankara during a wedding party, a prosecutor said yesterday.

The grenades were brought into Turkey under cover of diplomatic immunity, Ulku Coskun told The Associated Press in an interview. He would not elaborate, but said Ali Zeyyani, Libyan consul in Istanbul, knew of the plan.




