Center offers finals survival plan

Students discover more manageable it seems and the more realistic it is that you'll relief from exams actually get it accomplished," Kersh said.

For those students who take a laissez faire approach to their coursework, the end of the semester tends to be a desperate

attempt to salvage a decent grade-point average.

This time of year is often very stressful for students regardless of the amount of work they have put off.

The trap many students fall into is poor time management. While it may appear that there are not enough hours in the day to complete papers or study for finals, the key to success is orga-nizing a realistic study schedule.

Peri Kersh, a learning skills instructor in the Counseling and Testing Office, believes that finding a good place to study is essential to effective studying.

"If you can find a study place on campus that is accessible and convenient, you're going to be more likely to get your studying done," Kersh said. "Try to get off by yourself and away from dis-tractions as much as possible."

Once you have found your study place, having a plan is helpful. Blocking study time into two-hour segments, and allotting time for study breaks is an effective way to eliminate the stress of prolonged attempts to consume information.

The more you break (studying) down into small steps, the

Kersh said.

Study groups can prove to be more efficient when the exams are cumulative. By breaking the information into different parts, and assigning it to different people, it will allow you to cover more information than you would be able to do by yourself.

Students should also try to attend study sessions with the instructors and be prepared to ask questions. By talking to instructors, students might be able to figure out what to expect on the exam.

Equally important is maintaining a regular schedule when it comes to eating and sleeping. A lack of sleep and a reliance on caffeine could result in a crash that could easily ruin the next couple of days.

Students should also try to avoid eating heavy meals during the day because they tend to lead to fatigue. Exercising is a good way to relieve the physical stress that accumulates during long hours of studying.

"A lot of times, at the end of the semester, people just forget

"A lot of times, at the end of the semester, people just forget about exercising, forget about eating right and forget about sleeping the necessary number of hours," Kersh said. "You can really fry yourself out quickly by neelecting those things."



LSAT, GRE add to obligations

Study. Study. Study. With finals on the horizon, some of the UK's seniors already have had their share of this activity —

and then some.

On Dec. 2 four White Hall Classroom Building lecture halls were packed with test takers. From 8:30 a.m. to 1 p.m., the Law School Admission Test was demistered to Using in the control of the source of the sourc administered to University stu-dents and members of the Lex-ington community. For many of those participating, the test served as an added stress during a time already hectic because of

a time already heetic because of finals preparation.

"I feel like I have never not been studying for a test this semester," said Cheri Pettit, a communications senior who hopes to go on to the UK College of Law next fall. "But luckily

lege of Law next fall. "But luckily some of my classes have had papers and projects as finals, so I don't have too many tests to study for."

For many other seniors planning their futures, the Graduate Record Exam is also a vital step. The exam, somewhat like the LSAT, is used when evaluating those applying to graduate school. The GRE was offered Saturday, and like many of the LSAT test-takers, stress and hours of preparation were plentiful. With finals falling so close to

the test date, though, some felt

they were not as ready for the exam as they had hoped to be. "Actually, I was unable to study for the GRE like I had planned because I had to concentrate on my classes at the same time," said Christine VonSick, hospitality management senior. "Because I hadn't been able to study as much as I wanted, I was really nervous when I went into the test."

Matt Bowdy, communications senior, plans to pursue a degree in communications or higher education administration at UK or the University of Vermont at Burlington.

"(Studying for the GRE) just kind of fell by the wayside," Bowdy said. "I started studying for it and then other things came

up."

In addition to studying for both final examinations and the LSAT or GRE, applicants are busy filling out application forms, writing personal statements and soliciting letters of recommendation. Their nerves won't ease for quite some time. won't ease for quite some time either. The verdict is out on the LSAT and GRE scores for at least 4-6 more weeks. So, students are beginning some more last-minute studying

for finals and hoping for the best.
"I'm just glad (the GRE) is over. I can't wait until they all over. I can't wait are," VonSick said.

This men's SEC Tournament


moves this season to New Orleans' Super Dome and will be played March 7-10.



Most people think of the holiday season as a time of kindness and good will toward others, but for robbers and thieves, the season of joy can be the season

of big profits.
Unfortunately, while many are busy giving and receiving, others are busy pick-pocketing

and stealing.

Knowing how to protect yourself and your valuables this holiday season may save you from falling victim to theft

around campus.
"We usually see the most increase in book theft and auto larceny during the holiday season," said Crime Prevention Coordinator Stephanie Bastin.

Because the winter holiday season also marks the end of a semester, students will be rushing to bookstores, selling back their books.

Students need to keep an extra eye out in order to keep their books out of the hands of a

Bastin suggested never leaving books unattended in the

library or campus eateries.
"If you leave your table to go get something to eat or a drink of water, take your books with you," Bastin said.

Car break-ins are the second most prevalent form of campus crime during this season. Bastin said students and fac-

ulty should take extra time to make sure all valuables and preleaving the car. Also make sure to lock all doors.

"If you leave anything of value such as CDs or cellular phones in the car. wo're just

phones in the car, you're just inviting (robbers)," Bastin said.

Safety tips

♦ Don't walk alone at night.

Stay alert of surroundings.

♦ Walk in well-lit areas, away from large shrubbery.

> ◆ Don't leave purse, books, backpacks unattended.

Always lock your car.

♦ Make sure valuables are well-hidden.

Don't flash your money around.

Not only can valuables be stolen from your car, but thieves may snatch purses right out of your hands.

Bastin recommends walking around campus in numbers, especially at night.

Keep purses and bags tucked securely under your arm, to make them difficult for thieves

to grab. Because students will walking back and forth from the library at night before and during exams, the same sort of pre-cautions should be taken.

Discouraging a thief can be simple as walking with confidence, Bastin said.

dence, Bastin said.

Walk with your head up and
be aware of what is going on
around you. Someone walking
alone slumped over with their head down is an easy target to

thieves, because theives know that the person is unaware of their surroundings and will be

caught off guard.

Along those same lines, drivers should have their car keys ready and in hand before they even get to the car. A speedy car entry will allow a thief less time to sneak up on someone.

Although these tips may help safeguard students from thieves and attackers, the best bet (when walking alone) is to utilize the escort system sponsored by Student Government Association, she said.

By taking a few of these simple precautions, students can ensure their own safety and enjoy the holiday season with-

out the worry of theft.
